### HDI AS A INDICATOR

- HDI quantifies life expectancy, educational attainment, and income into a standardized number between zero and one; the closer to one, the more developed the country.
  - Most developed countries have HDIs of 0.8 or higher.
  - Life expectancy: Zero when life expectancy is 20 and equal to one when life expectancy is 85
  - Education: Measures mean years of schooling for residents of a country
  - GNI (gross national income) per capita based on purchasing power parity (PPP).
- This index is useful for examining the impact of policy choices made by each nation.
- For example, if two countries have approximately the same GNI per capita but wildly different HDI scores, then it stands to reason that these disparities could stem from policies regarding life expectancy, educational attainment, or another factor unrelated to economic health.

### EVOLUTION OF INDIAN PROSPERITY – INDIVIDUAL LEVEL

- India's per capita income increased from \$624 in 2004 to \$1,560 in 2014
- India's per capita income increased from \$1,560 in 2014 to \$2,411 in 2022.
- Long way to the threshold entry point of \$13,846, designated for a high-income category.
- Per capita income increased by 2.5 times during the 10 years post financial sector reforms
- If India can keep up that momentum over the next two and half decades, it can hope to reach the high-income threshold.
- In PPP terms, GDP per capita was already at \$7,112 in 2022. One dollar in India can buy roughly three times more goods and services than what it can buy in the US.

As a result, the headcount ratio of people in extreme poverty, measured at \$2.15 a day (2017 PPP), has come down from 39.9 per cent in 2000 to 11.9 per cent in 2021.
