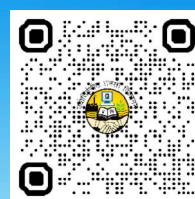

Eligibility and Age Group for Candidates:

All undergraduate and post graduate students, and research scholars

- Size:** A3, 29.7 X 42 cm, maximum
- Colour / medium for the painting:** Any medium
- Only one submission per participant** acceptable; sending more submission disqualifies candidature
- The piece of painting should be original and personally executed**, must not have been submitted to any other competition
- The painting must not be accomplished in a directed, step by step class or workshop
- The entries should not be copied from other artists or copyrighted material or someone else's real life/ still life set up or photo. All candidates will put their signature, which shows their ownership and acceptance to face any litigation about the copy rights/ownership/originality issues, if any.
- Submission:** Paintings to be submitted in JPEG image format through conference email-id: indigenousepeople2020@gmail.com. The image must be cropped to include only the art work. The painting must be smaller than 5 MB, with at least 1920 pixels on the longest side, and 72 dpi;
- The organizers will have copyright for the art work
- Adjudication:**
 - Evaluation criteria includes points for originality, presentation and creativity;
 - Judges decision shall be final.
