Recognising that work is a part life but not ones whole life we have taken further care to provide a nurturing environment for our future generation via access to a Day Care Center, where children can


have home away from home.

It is useful to recall the origins amidst the crisis of the G 20. The roots of this grouping can be traced back to meetings of Finance Ministers and Central bank Governors from 1988-89 of the 20 largest economies and the immediate context was the realisation that these powerful economies needed to work together to address the Asian Financial Crisis. This idea of the grouping of major economies was however a durable one.

The grouping of finance ministers and central bank governors was known as the D20 at the time, and it lasted about a decade. In 2001, India presided over the D20 meeting in New Delhi. However, at the next major crisis – the global financial crisis– in 2008 and 2009, caused many people in various parts of the world to conclude, more or less simultaneously, that a meeting of finance ministers is insufficient, that this grouping needed to address issues raised by the Global Financial Crisis at the head of government or head of the state level. The current idea of the G20 was thus born in 2008. Its 'crisis origins' or crisis context is useful to keep in mind.


India has been a member of the G20 and, previously of the D20 since their inception. After the formation of the G 20 in 2008, its first meeting was held in the United States. It has a rotating system for its Presidency. One of the countries in this group becomes the chair for the year. As you are aware we are, because of this rotational principle, the President of the G 20 this year. The G20 however has no permanent structure. It does not have a secretariat as the UN does. It is nevertheless a confederation of the world's major economies and thus a valuable platform.

So, what is the significance of the forthcoming G 20 summit for India? There are several reasons why this is of significance. It is evidently important because it is a great honour for us to lead this process for a year, with the participation of the leaders of twenty important countries. But there is an added significance because of a specific context: there is a growing concern in the world today than the world's principal international organisations, which is the UN on the political side and the IMF and the WTO on the financial and trade side are not pulling their weight in terms of the major global challenges that exist, whether it is climate change, the debt crisis, the global economy as a whole, or the future of globalisation.











And the impression is that these major international organisations are not sufficiently representative of global complexities as they exist today or more simply that many issues of global concern are being insufficiently addressed. India as the current chair has thus an opportunity to try and redress this imbalance. In brief the opportunity to inscribe concerns of developing countries or the global south more prominently on the world's governance agenda.

The summit in India is also important because, if we see it as a part of a continuum, a pattern emerges. Indonesia was the previous chair. India is current chair. Brazil will be the next chair, and South Africa will follow. So, for the next four years, we will have the G 20 Presidency coming from the developing world or the Global South. Clearly then there is an opportunity for the developing world to make its voice heard in this international grouping with greater conviction and clarity. As we have read in the news, India recently organised the Global South Deliberation.


We can also situate the current context of the G 20 as being in the midst of a number of longer and medium term crisis situations and trends. What are the dimensions of the different crises? The first is the uneven and hesitant pace of recovery from the pandemic, as well as the impact of the pandemic on global supply chains. So the COVID or post Covod scenario is one dimension. The second is of a global economic contraction caused by the pandemic in part but to an extent can be related to an older pre pandemic trend. The third dimension is that of the climate crisis, and there are many aspects to the climate crisis that can be discussed. Alongside these there are major political challenges. The first and most evident is the conflict in Ukraine and secondly there is the question of China's rise and assertion and the issues this raises for other countries.

What are the main agenda items that India will advocate at this summit? The G20 has a very broad agenda. There will be approximately 250 meetings, some of which have already begun taking place. There are broadly four or five central points that India will be pushing. To an extent, these issues are also carryovers from previous summits, but possibly the Indian Presidency will give them an extra impetus. The most important of these will be to ensure that recovery from the pandemic is both quick and broad-based. This is obviously a central question that we face today in India, as well as in many other developing countries and developed ones.











Second, how do we deal with the problem of the global recession which is rapidly approaching? How do we boost growth? Again, this is a critical issue for us, both domestically and in our external approaches and policy.

The third issue, which has recently gained additional prominence, is debt. We have three very dramatic examples in our immediate neighbourhood of a debt situation that spiralled out of the control of the concerned government. We witnessed what occurred in Sri Lanka a few months ago. We can see what's going on today in Pakistan; and Bangladesh could well also be facing difficulty.. As a result, the debt issue has taken on a much larger role than it previously had.

Aside from these economic issues, there are also major political challenges. The first and most obviously is the war in Europe. Then there is the question of China's emergence as a major power. A new global power emerges once every 50–60 years. As a result of this process existing arrangements and architectures are confronted by the need to change and consequently the global political situation becomes unstable. So, how should we address the China issue? We can't obviously ignore it or take a rigidly confrontational stance towards it, as some countries would like to. In India we cannot simplistically classify China as a threat alone because it is also an opportunity. In brief, the Chinese economy is a great opportunity for many countries, including India, but other aspects of China's growth are politically destabilising.

What about the narratives that surround the G20 Summit in India and our Presidency. Some believe that we are 'talking up' our Presidency excessively and the hype is now clouding reality. This view must be balanced by the consideration that this is that this is an important multilateral meeting quite regardless of where it is held simply because it is an platform for some of the most important world leaders to get together A the host country we are provided with a platform for us to showcase ourselves and to push ideas of concern to us on to the global priority list. This type of opportunity only comes around once in a decade or two. So, if you have the opportunity we must take advantage of it.












At the same time, we must be cognizant of the limitations of multilateralism. When we look at our neighbours to the east and west, we easily observe two nations where multilateralism has been of limited utility, whether in the form of UN initiatives or other regional endeavours. One example is provided by Afghanistan. It is well known where the country is and how it is regressing socially, but the rest of the world can only watch. We may impose sanctions and place restrictions on it but these may not have much effect. The second example is Myanmar, where massive international sanctions have been imposed but again has made no real difference to the internal direction of change in that country. So, we must keep in mind that multilateralism has its limitations and we must be cautious about having excessively high expectations of what can emerge from this G 20 Summit.

One of the main challenges India faces in hosting this summit is the current state of relationships between the major powers: the United States and the European Union on the one side and Russia on another. China poses a similar set of issues given the continuing momentum that the US China rivalry is gathering. This makes the goal of finding common ground on an agenda that benefits developing countries like India that much more difficult. This will be the diplomatic challenge that we will face as the Summit draws closer and the success of this summit will depend on whether or not we can find a way to bring these major players together on key issues.

#### **LEADERSHIP**

Leadership is the process of influencing others towards the accomplishment of goals. It is the ability to induce subordinates to work with zeal and confidence. In short, it is the activity of influencing people to strive willingly for group objectives. For every company or organization, good leadership is a prerequisite to be successful and good leaders are vital for effective management practices.

#### Traditional theories of Leadership

In 1930s Psychologist Kurt Lewin and his fellow researchers identified three different school of thoughts of leadership styles known as traditional theories. There are various approaches and styles, a leader may follow in managing a team, making plans and decisions, implementing and evaluating those plans, providing direction and motivating team members to pursue goals.

- 1. Directive or autocratic style: As per this approach, a leader makes most decisions without consulting other group members. He controls group members by using rewards and discipline, and permits very little individual freedom of action. Group members are dependent on the leader to establish goals and plan activities.
- 2. Participative or democratic style: Leaders following this style, involve individuals in decision making and goal setting. They delegate authority and responsibility to group members. These leaders use two-way communication and are considerate about the attitudes and feelings of team members.
- 3. Free rein or laissez- faire style: In this leadership style, members are permitted to function essentially on their own. Communication is open, and can take any direction. While this style can be effective in situations where group members are highly qualified in an area of expertise, it often leads to poorly defined roles and a lack of motivation.











### Modern theories of leadership

During the past 100 years, as interest in the psychology of leadership has grown, a variety of leadership theories have been developed to explain why and how specific individuals become outstanding leaders. Early theories of leadership emphasised the characteristics that set leaders apart from followers, but later modern theories examined additional elements like situational considerations and skill levels.

Transactional and Transformational leadership are classified under the modern leadership theory and are considered relevant for the modern workplace.

- 1. Transactional Leadership: Transactional leadership is a leadership approach which uses rewards and penalties to control and inspire subordinates. Max Weber, a sociologist, first introduced this leadership theory and Bernard M. Bass expanded on it in the early 1980s. This method of leadership places a strong emphasis on structure, organisation, supervision, performance, and results. The group's objectives and tasks are quite regimented, and members receive praise when they succeed in achieving them and criticism when they miss deadlines. Rewards and penalties under transactional leadership are hence based on the performance of the followers. The leader sees the connection between managers and employees as a trade. When employees perform well, they are rewarded. They will receive some sort of punishment if they perform poorly.
- 2. Transformational Leadership: James MacGregor Burns, a presidential biographer and leadership expert, is credited with first introducing the idea of transformative leadership. Transformational leadership is when "leaders and followers make each other move to a greater degree of moral and motivation." Transformational leaders offer a purpose that transcends short-term goals and focuses on higher-order intrinsic needs. A transformational leader has four components; Charisma, Inspiration(motivation), intellectual stimulation and individualized attention. This kind of leader tends to lead effective and devoted teams. They devote a lot of time and effort to the team and genuinely care about the team's success. Due to the high level of devotion that transformative leaders may engender in their followers, turnover tends to be quite low.











### Situational/ contingency Leadership style

Since all leadership theories cannot be applied universally in every organization's setting, situational or contingency theory of leadership has served as a better solution. This theory states that, leadership is greatly affected by the situation around and the leader is required to behave and act accordingly at given point of time. Therefore, the theory denies any hard and fast rules for the leaders in order to be effective. The emphasis of situational leadership is not on leadership traits and personalities rather its upon the particular situation in which a leader operates. As per the theory, a good leader is one who knows how to react in a situation in the best possible manner. Fiedler suggested that three major situational variables determine whether a given situation is favorable to leaders:

- (i) their personal relations with the members of their group (leader-member relations)
- (ii) the degree of structure in the task that their group has been assigned to perform (task structure) and
- (iii) the power and authority that their position provides (position power).

There can be several factors which affects these situations and leader's action to it, for instance, subordinate's personality, leader's personality, task requirements, organizational demands, team opinion, values and beliefs etc. There are several examples of renowned brands in which the failure of a leader in assessing a situation has resulted in the downfall. For instance, Moser Baer, Kodak, Nokia etc. Therefore, it is important for leaders especially in the current dynamic environment to critically assess the demand of the situation and act likewise. This can be done if leaders are well aware with the change management concept and its fair application in organizational settings.

### Change Management


Change management is a collective term for all approaches to prepare, support, and help individuals, teams, and organizations in making organizational change.

It includes methods that redirect or redefine the use of resources, business process, budget allocations, or other modes of operation that significantly change a company or organization.











### Kurt Lewin's Change Management Model

Kurt Lewin's change management model is a three-step process that involves unfreezing, changing, and refreezing. The unfreezing stage involves creating motivation for change by breaking down the status quo. This is followed by the changing stage where new ideas and practices are introduced. Finally, the refreezing stage involves making the new practices a permanent part of the organization's culture. The model is widely used for implementing change in various settings.

Leadership Role in 21st Century

The 21st-century is characterized by constant disruption. Business markets are volatile. The end customer's behavior is uncertain. Even before the pandemic, Gartner Analyst Mark P McDonald noted that 21st-century leaders must be artists; they must have an ability to adapt rapidly in a world of work where a talent to 'relate, create, and instigate change' defines overall success. 21st-century leadership is therefore rooted in the ability to:

- Relate: Leaders need to make a shift from production-based management to peoplecentric management, relating with teams to better drive performance.
- Create: Leaders need to create new ways of working and introduce new processes that redefine standards and generate strategies that work today.
- Instigate Change: Leaders need to be at the forefront of change, actively introducing and using new processes and motivating teams to accept change.

In the face of multiple emerging leadership and management challenges, agility is the cornerstone of 21st-century leadership. In short, being flexible, open to change, and reactive.











#### Lord and Leader: Ganesha

The name "Ganesha" is a combination of two Sanskrit words; "Gana", meaning a group, and "Isha", meaning the master or leader. Ganesha is considered as an obstacle remover and the one who shows the right path. There is a lot we can learn from Ganesha as a leader. I have attempted to derive the leadership qualities in reference to the appearance of Lord Ganesha.

Leader should be visionary: Lord Gajanana's big head depicts thinking big and one should have an intellectual mind filled with information, knowledge, wisdom, and vision.

Europe G20 Day Day-1

Directorate of International Affairs (DIA) organized a two-day program on G20 Europe Day in the GGSIPU from March 28-29, 2023. The program was meant to apprise students about international relations with Europe, study and business opportunities among the European G 20 countries and India.

There were 64 participants including students from various courses and research scholars.

On 28th March 2023, the two sessions were held. The first event welcomed the dignitaries par excellence, Sh. Manoj Kumar, Advisor to Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, and Mr. Sanjeev Roy, Senior Key Expert-Higher Education European Union Policy and Outreach Partnerships (EUPOP), India. The event started with the floral welcome of all the dignitaries by Prof. Vijita Singh Aggarwal, Director, International Affairs.















### Europe G20 Day

Sh. Manoj Kumar, motivated students to take advantage of India's G20 presidency for widening their horizons. Sh. Manoj Kumar said that "G20 presidency has come at the right time. Today, we're at the cusp of things because of our young population. India has youngsters who are tech-savvy and competitive. He further narrated stories of his own school times to give a glimpse of availability of limited resources and yet high spirit of students and respect for teachers to learn and grow in life. Europe G20 Day Day-2

There are other countries in the world that are more powerful than Europe but it still holds some power in various affairs like density of petrol, alphonso mango which is exported from India. Even India has adopted many standards from United Kingdom and India also have a very special relation with Europe as we are in continuous trade with European countries in almost all fields be it medicine, automobile, food and beverages. United Kingdom understands China creating a hegemony and thus UK's interest in investing in India to balance it out or about a deal that UK and India want to expedite on trade and investment on comparatively free trade. The session ended with sir explaining that India will be third largest economy by 2030 and if so, then how the lives will be affected when India becomes a powerful economy and it will be very crucial years for us to experience. The session was filled with detailed information about the two countries and it was an interactive and well informed session. All the participants appreciated the session. Lastly the session was ended with a question answer session followed by a vote of thanks.













# Lecture on "Contemporary developments and challenges in International Relations"

The Directorate of International Affairs (DIA) organized the expert lectureon "Contemporary developments and challenges in International Relations" on March 5th, 2023. The lecture was delivered by the eminent speaker former Indian Ambassador to Kazakhstan, Sweden, and Latvia, Mr. Ashok Sajjanhar. The lecture was attended by young diplomats from Gambia, Lesotho, Eritrea, and Cape Verde, international students of the university and other students of the university. Speaking on the occasion, Mr. Sajjanhar highlighted the significance of "India's G20 Presidency" and discussed how India through its bold leadership and prudent policies has been able to successfully navigate the headwinds over the last few years. According to him, India has also emerged as a strong and clear voice of the global south. During the lecture, Mr. Ashok Sajjanhar focussed on the "Contemporary developments and challenges in International Relations" and also spoke briefly on the "evolution of the Indian Foreign Policy".

Students and diplomats asked lot of questions to Mr. Sajjanhar about diplomacy, India's presidency of G20 and all of them were very happy to learn tremendously from the speaker of the day.















# Launched a Programme on "International Relations and Global Diplomacy

The Directorate of International Affairs, Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University (New Delhi) launched a Management Development Programme on "International Relations and Global Diplomacy" on March 11, 2023for young diplomats looking to gain a deeper understanding of International Politics and diplomatic issues. This 20 hours MDP was designed in line with Sustainable Development Goals (Goal 4 and Goal 17) set forth by the United Nationson high demand from embassies. The programme will include sessions on international relations, global diplomacy, diplomatic protocols, dining and dressing etiquette for diplomatic events. The programme started with a lecture by a very eminent speaker Professor (Dr.) Jitendra Nath Misra. He holds a Ph.D. from Jawaharlal Nehru University and is a retired Indian diplomat. He has not only served as ambassador in Portugal and Laos, and consul general in Ho Chi Minh City but also is a regular voice at BBC on Indian diplomatic issues and International Relations. He is a prolific writer in newspapers and speaker on various international platforms.

Dr. Jitendra Nath Mishra shared his vast experience as Diplomat with the participants which would help them in gaining in-depth knowledge about International Relations and Global Diplomacy. The topic of discussion was centered around "Indo-UK Relations in the post-colonial world." He emphasized the profound ties of culture, history, and language between India and the UK to further deepen relations between the two countries. During the lecture, Dr. Jitendra Nath Mishra, also mentioned his two interviews with BBC on 2nd March 2023 at the G20 Foreign ministers meeting.













### Workshop on Conflict Resolution in Global Scenario

As a part of the G20 Activity, the Directorate of International Affairs, GGSIPU conducted a workshop on "Conflict Resolution in Global Scenario" on 11th March 2023 to encourage the development of a new mindset, building from individual and collective experiences in the global scenario. Dr. Shilpa Jain, Assistant Professor, University School of Management Studies (USMS), GGSIPU conducted the workshop. She comes with a 22+ years of experience in Behaviour Testing, Counselling and Training working professionals. She explained the participants that how personality differences lead to conflicting situations and how one can communicate without causing defensiveness, de-escalate difficult situations, and process to resolve the conflicts in both work and social settings. She apprised participants about most commonly used conflict resolution style. She also conducted a test to help participants know their own conflict resolution style. Then she explained how can they make best use of their own styles and where should they remain careful while handling conflict situation.













### Interactive session on "Leadership Skills in the 21st Century."

On 18th March 2023, as part of the G20 activity, the Directorate of International Affairs organized an interactive session on "Leadership Skills in the 21st Century." The resource person for the session was Sh. Manoj Kumar, IAS retired and presently advisor to Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, GGSIPU. Sh. Manoj Kumar has served on positions likeChairman-cum-MD, Delhi Transport Corporation; Director Department of Training & Technical Education & Secretary to Governor, Mizoram. Speaking on the occasion, Sh. Manoj Kumar said that in this unprecedented era, there is a need for the leader to understand change.

Sh. Manoj Kumar discussed the meaning of leadership, traditional and modern theories, leadership role models, and 21st-century leadership models. He emphasized the "Change management" concept which is a collective term for all approaches to prepare, support, and help individuals, teams, and organizations in making organizational change. In this regard, he also mentioned the examples of How Moser Baer wiped out wealth due to wrong management decisions, Kodak's demise, and Nokia's downfall to make the participants understand the need for 21st-century leadership skills.


Speaking on the occasion, Sh. Manoj Kumar also discussed leadership role models such as Mahatma Gandhi and Nelson Mandela. Next, he focussed on the 21st century instant. He said that the 21st century is characterized by constant disruption. Business markets are volatile and end customers behaviour is uncertain so the 21st-century leaders must be artists. Thus, in this century leaders must have the ability to adapt rapidly. As the21st-century leadership is rooted in the ability to relate, create and instigate change. Participants had lot of interaction with him and enjoyed the session thoroughly.













# Special lecture by the Director of International affairs, Prof. Vijita Singh Aggarwal on Role of Non State Actors in International Relations

Directorate of International Affairs (DIA), GGSIPU, organized a special lecture by the Director of International affairs, Prof. Vijita Singh Aggarwal on Role of Non state actors in International Relations and Politics as a part of the G20 activity. This interactive session was held on 18th March 2023 in the GGSIPU. In the lecture on the role of non-state actors in international relations, Professor Vijita Singh Aggarwal highlighted the increasing importance of non-state actors in shaping global politics. She noted that these actors, including multinational corporations, NGOs, international organizations, and social movements, have significant influence on global governance, often playing a role in setting the political agenda, shaping policies, and mobilizing public opinion. She also emphasized that the rise of non-state actors has challenged the traditional understanding of international relations, which has been focused on the interactions between states. She argued that in today's globalized world, non-state actors have become key players in shaping international relations, both in terms of economic power and political influence.

Furthermore, the professor discussed the diverse roles that non-state actors play in global politics, including advocating for human rights and social justice, promoting environmental protection, and engaging in peacebuilding and conflict resolution efforts. She emphasized the importance of recognizing the power dynamics that exist between non-state actors and states, and the need for greater accountability and transparency in the actions of these actors.

Overall, the lecture highlighted the increasingly important role of non-state actors in shaping international relations, and the need for policymakers and scholars to take their influence into account when analyzing and responding to global issues.

The participants relished the continental cuisine and appreciated the fine details shared by the Chef and Sommelier at Hotel Taj.


















### Fashion & Dressing Etiquette in Contemporary International Networking Environment

Day 2- EDM Night with DJ Ravator


One of the youngest DJs and record producers' in the country, DJ Ravator, performed on the second day of Anugoonj'23, and ushered in the EDM night.
















#### **COMPETITIONS ORGANISED**

#### RANGOLI COMPETITION







#### Annual Lecture Under the series-"Rah Ro" By Inez Baranay

The University School of Humanities and Social Sciences (USHSS) of Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University (GGSIPU) organised an Annual Lecture under the series "Rah Ro" on the 17th of March, 2023 in room 505, C Block. The lecture was attended by the faculty, students and research scholars of the School. This lecture, delivered by Inez Baranay, an Australian fiction/non-fiction writer, was a part of the year-long celebration of the University's completion of 25 years of its existence as well as a part of the plethora of activities to acknowledge the year of India's G20 presidency. The Hon'ble Vice Chancellor Padma Shri Prof. (Dr.) Mahesh Verma was the Patron of the event and Prof. Vivek Sachdeva, Dean, USHSS was its convenor.

The event started with an official address and introduction to the speaker. Dr. Inez Baranay. In his address, Prof. Sachdeva talked about the idea behind naming the lecture series "Rah Ro". He informed that the word is borrowed from the poetry of Faiz Ahmad Faiz and stands for a traveller. Introducing Inez, he told that she was born in Naples, Italy and was immigrated to Australia when she was an infant. She has a Ph.D. in Creative Writing from Griffith University, Australia. Baranay began her writing career with Between Careers, published in 1992 after which she has continued to write novels, the latest being Turn Left at Venus (2019). Her journey as a traveller began with her first trip to Bali in the 1970s, after which she explored several countries of the world with India being one of the destinations that shaped her journey.

Prof. Sachdeva emphasised the fact that Baranay's journey as a travel writer transformed boundaries and expressed the situation of the times. He further talked about how the idea of identity and self has considerably changed with time, especially when the world is now perceived in the timeframes of pre-covid and post-covid times. Prof. Sachdeva also highlighted Baranay's diverse transnational background as a migrant who has experienced different regions and cultures during her lifetime. He then invited Baranay to deliver her lecture.


Dr Baranay started the lecture with an emphasis on her diverse background and upbringing. She then talked about the idea of digital nomads and how in these times people have been connected to the world while staying in a particular place. Baranay believed that a community of values is not marked by geography. She reflected on her identity as an Australian writer by which she is normally addressed, however, she observed that she would rather describe herself as an "English language writer". She explained that her identity as an "English language writer"does not limit her as "English has no nationality". Baranay continued to talk about how identity was fluid and how it changed with context and space.

The second part of her lecture focused on how the idea of India changed for her throughout these years. Baranay believed that her idea of India changed with her readings, writings and experiences here and that India as a country should rather be experienced than understood. She mentioned that her first visit to India was in 1980 an narrated how, as an initial traveller to India, she would only interact with foreign tourists and local service-givers. With time, her interest in the country led her to read works on its history and culture, two of which she highlighted were Ramachandra Guha's Rebels of the Raj and Shashi Tharoor's Inglorious Empire. She expressed how travelling helped her to absorb and experience the country in her own ways and created a new sense of self. Her second visit to India was in 1986, when she got acquainted with B.K.S. Iyengar, her Yoga guru, at the Iyengar Yoga Institute in Pune. Baranay talked about her travel to different parts of India and her experiences from staying in a houseboat in Kashmir and interacting with Tibetan refugees in Ladakh to visiting remote villages in Pune, and how these travels further modified/expanded her view of India.

Baranay further talked about the changing times in 1990s where India saw the surge of liberal economic policies. She referred to her novel Neem Dreams where the leading character is an Indian, named Meenakshi, and how through the novel she dismissed the cliched views on India. Inez further talked about her recent visit to India, where she is on a journey to explore more about the life of Halide Edib Adivar, who was a Turkish novelist, teacher, and feminist intellectual. She came across the works and ideas of Edib during her stay in Turkey in the 1990s. Baranay concluded the lecture by talking about the ideas of nation and nationhood and still contemplating on the question, "How does India change you?"

Baranay's lecture was followed by several intriguing questions and discussions from the audience. Prof. Ashutosh Mohan highlighted the importance of works written in regional languages and how these works could be significant in creating and moulding the idea of India. Prof. Vivek Sachdeva further discussed with the speaker about the changing form of the novel, especially from around the 1990s to the contemporary times. The challenges of publication and marketing of a written work were also discussed. Baranay maintained that the risk and insecurity of being published never held her back. She encouraged young writers to write without any inhibitions.

The Annual Lecture ended with the Dean's address and an official vote of thanks by Prof. Ashutosh Mohan.\

Five expert speakers addressed the technical, practical and legal aspects of architectural practice in the evolving global environment. He adds focus to the adoption of disruptive educational technologies which forces institutions to rethink their processes or adopt learning modules to compete with international institutions. He also highlighted other tech focused goals of NEP which includes access to open access software's, technology-based institution accreditation system, use of big tech in language translation, setting of academic bank of credit, digital storage for certificates and so on.

Professor Manukonda Rabindranath, our guest of honour, talked about the mission of NEP and why it has been the talk of the town. 

The goals and aims of NEP were further laid out by Prof AK Saini, Member secy of IIQAC who adds that NEP focuses on quality education and that achieving said quality is not a one- person job but will require a collective effort by governments, institutions, teachers, students, and parents. In terms of fulfilling the goals of NEP, GGSIPU has taken the right steps by introducing MOOCs, multiple entry and exit in certain programs, outcome-based courses and by giving students the freedom to choose their own courses as well.

Professor Varun Joshi, Coordinator of NSS (National Service Scheme), highlighted the importance of NSS both inside and outside the university, in the larger context of NEP. The end of this session was marked by a vote of thanks by Dr Sachin Bharati, co-coordinator of the seminar, USMC.


The plenary session was kicked off by a wonderful and interesting speech by professor Uma Shankar Pandey. He began by asking attendees to log onto mentimeter a software that enables users to share knowledge and real-time feedback with presentations, polls or brainstorming sessions in classes, meetings, gatherings, conferences and other group activities. The question that was asked was: how can classes be made more interesting?. Engaging, Practical and Interactive were the words that came out of the word cloud. In order to achieve that he said that there should be a relevancy of communication. There are times where even if the message is relevant, it is not necessary that it would be decoded by the receiver or students in the way intended by the teacher. He concluded by adding that policymakers, teachers, parents have to factor in the post covid realities of our society and try to be more empathetic in our approach towards learning and imparting knowledge.

Professor Awa Shukla, focused on the cultural aspects of the NEP and how it is a step in the right direction to promote our language and heritage. It is our duty to promote our culture, highlight our achievements get out of the colonial hangover. Same was echoed by Dr. Kiran Jha who said that NEP has recognized the glorious past of ancient India in terms of the contribution of our world-class Indian Universities like Nalanda and Takshshila. These institutions set the highest standards of multidisciplinary teaching and research and hosted scholars and students from across varying backgrounds and countries. In NEP, all curriculum and pedagogy, from the foundational stage onwards, will be redesigned to be strongly rooted in the Indian and local context and ethos in terms of culture, traditions, heritage, customs, language, philosophy, geography, ancient and contemporary knowledge, societal and scientific needs, indigenous and traditional ways of learning etc. – in order to ensure that education is maximally relatable, relevant, interesting, and effective for our students.

The more critical aspects of NEP were highlighted by Professor Mausumi Bhattacharya of Vishwa Bharati University with a focus on Gender inequality in education and neglect of marginalised communities like LGBTQIA. She said the goal of NEP should be to increase Gross Enrollment Ratio of women and transgender communities, working out ways to improve

their dropout rates, training more women teachers, creating a safe space for girls, imparting essential knowledge on female hygiene, investing in adequate infrastructure like enough toilets and schools and college in their vicinity, mode of transport etc. Finally, the successful execution of key initiatives of NEP requires availability of adequate financial resources for decades. In this regard, the NEP has stated that to realise the goals of the new policy, the country has to raise public spending on education to 6 percent of GDP. This is a daunting task if one considers the past promises and their actual realisation.


Dr Shikha Rai, Associate professor at IGNOU said that, since it is an one of its kind Open University, IGNOU is way ahead in implementing the NEP. That IGNOU primary goal has been to expand the reach of the University to achieve the targeted GER and include the unserved target groups including the SEDGs into the fold of higher education, Strengthening the University's international presence, Rethinking the processes of designing, developing and delivering an enhanced learning experience through technology-enabled teaching-learning methods. In line with NEP, the institution has regrouped disciplines, introduced multidisciplinary courses, integrated programs from different courses, has already trained 15 lakh teachers from a target of 50 lakh and so on. Post covid, the stigma around distance education is no longer relevant and that now more than ever, IGNOU's contribution to learning is being recognised and appreciated.

The technical session chaired of the conference was chaired by Dr Manash P Goswami, DR Santwan Chatterjee and Co Chaired by Dr. Akhilesh Upadhyay. Papers were presented by a participants that included assistant professor Sarita Yadav and Ankita Sharma from MERI college, New Delhi; Dheeraj Singh, research scholar doon university, Shelly Gupta and Himanshu, research scholars from USMS; Sanchita Dutta, JRF qualified independent researcher; Sumant Sharma, Assistant professor, USAP; Apratim Bhattarcharya and Lokesh Sharma, research scholars of Visva Bharati University.

Apratim's study on developing culture inclusion in NEP 2020 and integration of interdisciplinary education highlighted the need of education rooted in Indian culture, but with enough flexibility that allows for a critical discourse. He claims that the Visva Bharati approach to education is most suited to realise the goals of NEP that asks for a culturally inclusive education. Lokesh Chakma's research on the rise of OTT and its impact on education ends on cautionary note about ed tech platforms. Their apparent benefits have to be weighed with capitalist greed on which these platforms have thrived.

The end of the session was marked with summary remarks by Dr Santwan Chattopadhya who stressed on the importance of transdisciplinary approach towards generation of new knowledge. That the high ideals of NEP must be measured with actual ground impact, that teacher skill enhancement is as essential as filling existing posts and that state aided institutions has to be brought on par with central aided institutions.


Dr Manash P Goswami and Dr Akhilesh Upadhyay critically analysed the papers presented and gave helpful suggestions to the presenters on how to improve their papers so that can be published in a reputed journal.

Day 2 began with formal inauguration by Dr Durgesh Tripathi who felicitated our esteemed guests and in his address laid emphasis on strengthening our mother language and the need of enhancing and integrating technology in pedagogy, which are primary goals of NEP. This was followed by a plenary session by Prof. Ajay Rathore and Prof. Rachna Chaturvedi, Prof. Devita Patil, Prof. Manisha Sharma and Dr Manash P Goswami.

The session was started with a presentation given by Prof. Ajay Rathore who started by showing a video that explained how it was Indian who first taught the world how to organise time, date, week etc. India is in 4th position when it comes to contribution in research output but our citations remain low. Like individuals' nations also need to have a national aspiration or ambition. India has the capacity to offer something to the global community when they require critically. We have always respected mother nature and already incorporate the ideals of sustainable development. But he adds that India must develop a scientific temper, reject superstition, battle misinformation. Traditional wisdom should be filtered for misinformation and superstition and apply it in modern context. We must apply scientific probability, reasoning and objectivity and question and challenge misconceptions of seniors. We also have to improve assessment techniques, engage in outcome-based curriculum and increase the knowledge base of students so that they can generate new ideas, products and news ways of thinking and that is how we can truly become a Vishwa guru.









Seminar on- Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav: NEP, 2020 and Paradigm Shift in Indian Education

Professor Manash P Goswami talked about how NEP was started in 2020, in a pandemic year and truly tough time but the government went ahead and implemented it. He says that in implementing Nep, digital tech is going to be huge boon. Lack of knowledge and resources is also a barrier in implementing NEP. India has developed a great infrastructure for connectivity. People are now using phones to watch films, videos and other content all because of digital infrastructure. Technology will also break the barriers of caste, class and other social barberries. He is hopeful that even the remotest areas will gain access to information thanks to internet. Digital universities will come up and will change the whole education scenario. Many people will now get the opportunity to enrol in courses which were otherwise out of their reach. But he also cautions that if digital technology is not rolled out across the country it can further digital divide and result in digital depression. Also, digital technologies come with other challenges like fake news, clickbait, misinformation but the positivise of the such technology outweigh the negatives.

Prof Daivita Patil, asked students about amarkantak, and as expected students had no idea about the place. She says that amarkantak is a beautiful place but is not recognised whereas Sydney which is thousands of miles away is famous. So why NEP was needed: to bring back out students to know about out culture, our heritage. The people in remote areas are the true upholders of our culture and heritage. Macaulay thought us rote learning but we forgot our traditional skills and were unable to acquire skills and thus remained unemployed. To make our country a vishwaguru, our students need to change their mindsets and then only they can be the future of this country. We also need to bridge the urban rural gap and along with focus on technology, we need to bring our most underpriviledged people along. She concludes by saying that education is not about earning crores but about handling the challenges of life and leading happier life.












Seminar on- Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav: NEP, 2020 and Paradigm Shift in Indian Education

Prof Rachna gave her presentation titled AISECT-A practical approach to NEP which deals with how to apply NEP, what is exactly happening and what to do?. She talks about how AISECT will help marginalised communities to get better access to education. AISECT provides skills to people required in the unorganised sector and to remain sustainable without needing any outside help. AISECT focuses on how people can earn money which is the basic question for everyone. Focusing on basic skill based training like typing, word processing etc has helped people a lot. She gives the example of Benaras where AISECT trained a few girls basic autocad and therafter they could deisgn sarees which earlies used to take months. She gives valuable insights on the importance of regional languages in education. By just keeping the conversation in regional language, students can learn more efficiently in rural areas. They are also hiring local people to impart knowledge. This according to her, are the ways through which NEP can be employed practically.

Prof. Devita Patil referenced Dmitry Zealado's book on rituals and how rituals are required to purge out our emotions. There is a thin line between rituals and superstition. She also talked about bringing women to the job market. She touches on the systematic oppression of patriarchy and other pressing issues. There should be a transdisciplinary and multidisciplinary approach in resolving issues in our education system. Systemic design changes in language use and language approach will certainly help in resolving our existing problems. She cites example of Sweden where both male and female are referred to as Han. This according to her are more bottoms up approach which along with top down approach are also needed. So along with policy changes, societal changes are also needed. She highlighted many issues that woman face: an example of which is that even though enrolment of women in media colleges is high, their presence is very low because of systemic issues in the media field. She adds that implementing NEP alone is not enough, and that auditing its achievements both qualitatively and quantitatively is of outmost importance and so is language decolonisation. She concludes by saying that process is more important than the product itself.

Post lunch, technical session began which was chaired by Sanjay Kumar, Prof Sayan Chattterjee and Co chaired by Dr Preeti Singh and Prof Umesh Pathak. A total of 7 papers were presented: Dr Upasana Khurana, Dr Sheel Nidhi Tripathy, Dr Rakhee, Miss Bhavyanshi Goel, Namrita Jain, Aman Dubey and Dr Sheela Narang.

Dr Sheel Nidhi Tripathy talked about Vasudhev Kutmbakam through NEP, 2020. This concept originates from vedic scripture Maha Upanishad and it translates For those who have a big heart the entire world constitutes the family. The principles of Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam aligns well with the goal of NEP2020 and promotes intercultural education, respect for diversity: linguistic, geographic, cultural and so on.


Dr Rakhee presented her paper titled investigating the importance of NEP 2020 projecting digitalisation in higher education institutions. Many higher education institutions have utilised technology to provide students with flexible learning options during class instruction. From a student's point of view Digitalisation enhances their education and increases cognitive retention and from a teachers perspective it helps enhance their teaching and increases their productive. She also explained dual digitalisation which comprises of digitalisation of education and the subjects. She finally concludes that NEP aims to achieve triad digitalisation i.e. making a shared digital space for students and teachers.

UI/UX event was organised on 28th March The participants were given 150 minutes to design a website with themes of education and healthcare with seamless user experience (UX) and user Interface (UI).



#### **HALF MARATHON-2023**


















### Event Organised by Trinity Institute of Professional Studies
















# Event Organised by Pradeep Memorial Comprehensive College of Education

### Event Organised by JIMS Vasant Kunj, Delhi


















#### Event Organised by Maharaja Agarsen Institute of Technology
















#### Event Organised by Maharaja Agarsen Institute of Technology
















### Event Organised by Bhavan's Leelawati Munshi College of Education and Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan College
















#### Event Organised by Rukmini Devi Institute of Advanced Studies
















Guest Lecture on "Data & Technology: Instrumental in effective decision making"
















### Event Organised by Maharaja Agrasen Institute of Technology
















#### Case Study Discussion Challenge
















#### Handmade Flower Arrangements
















#### Pratibimb - Swachhh Bharat
















#### Shaheed Diwas- 2023

With deep sense of gratification, we take pride in the successful completion of the camp by the NSS volunteers of the College.



Special Lecture on "Artificial Intelligence Inspired Global Vision of Engineering Students"



















## Event Organised by ACCMAN Business School, Greater Noida
















# Event Organised by ACCMAN Business School, Greater Noida

The activity was conducted successfully and the pupil teachers participated enthusiastically in this activity.


















Extension lecture on Action Research

An Extension lecture on SOLVING SCHOOL PROBLEMS THROUGH ACTION RESEARCH was held on Tuesday, March 21, 2023, at the Giarattan Institute of Advanced Studies and Training and the speaker was Dr. S.K. Bhatia (former Associate professor, CIE, University of Delhi). He has stood as the institution's anchor and is a foundation of academic success in all spheres.

Dr. S.K. Bhatia sir started his lecture by sharing his own personel experience of Army Public School, Subroto Park. He followed inductive approach to make all understand the concept of Action Research in 1960.He then mentioned how this extension lecture on action research will be beneficial for all the student teachers and covers most of the crucial details related to the topic.

After the brief introduction, Dr. S.K.Bhatia talked about prof. Stefen M. Corey who give the concept of action research. Then sir told us that action research simply means solving a local problem in a local setting. It is necessary for educational practioners to do action research for improving the learning process.

We further discussed about processes involved in the action research including designing, collecting data, analysis of problem involved and the outcome and corrective strategies for solving problems. Afterwards sir discussed about purpose of action research. Sir told us that action research is beneficial for us while writing teachers diary in future and setting instructional and learning objectives. After discussing all the aspects of action research, sir concluded the lecture by giving various examples in which action research can be done. It includes problems like truancy in class, remedying an inattentive student, improving students' handwriting and many more. All the B.Ed trainees and faculty attended the lecture and it was a very illuminating session with Bhatia sir, as usual we are happy to have him becase his expertise and direction are always very valuable to us.













Hakathon Activity: Digital story competition



### TRIVIA

The G20 Presidency steers the G20 agenda for one year and hosts the Summit. The G20 consists of two parallel tracks: the Finance Track and the Sherpa Track.

The G20 process from the Sherpa side is coordinated by the Sherpas of member countries, who are personal emissaries of the Leaders. Finance Track is led by Finance Ministers and Central Bank Governors of the member countries.

The Finance Track is mainly led by the Ministry of Finance. These working groups meet regularly throughout the term of each Presidency.

There are Engagement Groups which bring together civil societies, parliamentarians, think tanks, women, youth, labour, businesses and researchers of the G20 countries.

The Group does not have a permanent secretariat. The Presidency is supported by the Troika - previous, current and incoming Presidency. During India's Presidency, the troika will comprise Indonesia, India and Brazil, respectively.
