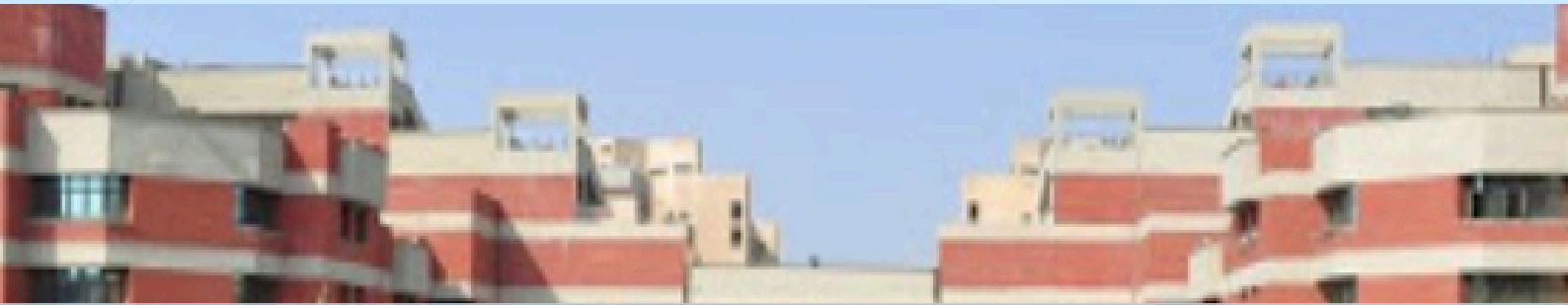

ABOUT LAC

The Legal Aid Centre, USLLS, GGSIPU, has actively bridged legal education with community service through its impactful initiatives. The Centre received the National Legal Aid Clinic Excellence Award and was also recognised as the Best Legal Aid Centre in Delhi (2023) for its extensive outreach and innovation. Over 127 students were trained as Para-Legal Volunteers under DSLSA, empowering them to provide legal assistance to marginalized communities. Through Project Saksham, students visited rural areas to address issues like domestic violence and legal unawareness, promoting community empowerment. In collaboration with Migration and Asylum Project (MAP), specialised training was conducted to sensitize students on refugee and asylum rights. The Centre further organised awareness camps, nukkad natak, and Jan Sunwais, extending free legal aid to the underprivileged. Its holistic efforts continue to make legal rights accessible while nurturing socially responsible law students.

EVENT STRUCTURE

The Legal Aid Centre acknowledges the critical importance of addressing delays in the delivery of free legal services, which continue to undermine access to justice for economically and socially disadvantaged communities. To foster a deeper engagement with these issues, the Centre proposes a full-day event that combines a panel discussion with interactive learning components, including an online quiz competition and a PIL Drafting competition. This comprehensive approach aims to enhance knowledge retention, promote scholarly discourse, and encourage solution-oriented thinking among law students.

I. PANEL DISCUSSION: “RETHINKING FREE LEGAL AID IN INDIA”

India's constitutional promise of justice for all remains unfulfilled for millions who cannot afford legal representation. Despite the Legal Services Authorities Act, 1987 establishing a comprehensive framework for free legal aid, significant systemic challenges continue to obstruct access to justice for marginalized communities. This panel discussion will bring together distinguished legal professionals, leading academics, and field practitioners to critically examine these structural deficiencies and explore pathways toward meaningful reform.

The discussion will dissect multifaceted challenges plaguing India's legal aid ecosystem—from procedural backlogs that delay justice indefinitely, to fragmented coordination between Legal Services Authorities that creates resource misallocation and jurisdictional confusion. Particular focus will be placed on inadequate outreach mechanisms that leave vulnerable populations unaware of their entitlements, compounded by geographical barriers, digital divides, and bureaucratic hurdles. The panelists will also address quality concerns surrounding panel lawyer training, compensation structures, and accountability frameworks. The session will conclude with a student-moderated Q&A, providing emerging legal minds an opportunity to engage directly with experts and contribute fresh perspectives to this critical discourse on democratizing justice in India.

2. ONLINE QUIZ COMPETITION: “LEGAL AID KNOWLEDGE CHALLENGE”

Following the panel discussion, an interactive online quiz competition will transform passive learning into active engagement, allowing participants to test their comprehension of India's legal aid framework and the systemic challenges explored during the panel. This competition is designed not merely as an assessment tool but as a dynamic learning experience that reinforces critical concepts surrounding access to justice, procedural mechanisms, institutional frameworks, and reform imperatives. By translating complex legal discourse into thoughtfully crafted questions, the quiz will challenge participants to recall key insights, analyze case scenarios, and apply theoretical knowledge to practical situations; thereby deepening their understanding of how legal aid functions and where it falters in the Indian context.

The competitive format will create an intellectually stimulating environment that encourages participants to engage more rigorously with the subject matter while fostering a spirit of healthy academic competition. Participants will navigate questions spanning constitutional provisions, statutory frameworks, landmark judgments, comparative perspectives, and contemporary challenges in legal aid delivery. The quiz will accommodate diverse difficulty levels, from foundational questions testing basic awareness to nuanced scenarios requiring analytical reasoning, ensuring inclusivity while rewarding depth of understanding. Beyond individual achievement, this competition aims to cultivate a broader awareness of social justice issues and inspire future legal professionals to contribute meaningfully toward bridging the gap between legal rights and their realization for India's most vulnerable populations.

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3. PIL DRAFTING COMPETITION

The Public Interest Litigation Drafting Competition offers participants a unique opportunity to translate theoretical legal knowledge into practical advocacy by crafting comprehensive PILs addressing pressing socially relevant issues. Public Interest Litigation has emerged as one of India's most powerful instruments for democratic participation and social justice, enabling citizens to invoke the judiciary's intervention on matters affecting collective rights and public welfare. This competition challenges participants to identify systemic injustices or constitutional violations, whether concerning environmental degradation, marginalized community rights, government accountability, access to essential services, or violations of fundamental freedoms—and construct legally sound, persuasive petitions that could withstand judicial scrutiny. Through this exercise, participants will develop critical competencies in legal research, constitutional interpretation, precedent analysis, and persuasive legal writing while grappling with the procedural and substantive requirements that govern PIL practice in India.

The competition demands not merely technical proficiency but also a deep engagement with constitutional values, social realities, and the transformative potential of strategic litigation. Participants must demonstrate their ability to articulate clear cause-and-action connections, establish locus standi under relaxed PIL norms, substantiate factual claims with credible evidence, identify appropriate constitutional and statutory provisions, cite relevant jurisprudence, and formulate practical relief that balances judicial restraint with effective remediation. Beyond drafting skills, this competition encourages participants to think as public-spirited lawyers who view litigation as a tool for systemic reform rather than individual gain. By engaging with issues affecting vulnerable populations from environmental justice and labor rights to educational access and healthcare equity, participants will cultivate a socially conscious legal perspective that recognizes law's role in advancing equity, dignity, and constitutional ideals in Indian democracy.

4. EXTEMPORE COMPETITION

The Extempore Competition represents the culminating challenge of this event, designed to test participants' ability to think critically and articulate persuasively under pressure; skills that lie at the heart of effective legal advocacy. In this spontaneous speaking competition, participants will receive a legal or social topic moments before taking the stage, requiring them to marshal their knowledge, structure coherent arguments, and deliver compelling speeches in either Hindi or English within strict time constraints. This format mirrors the reality of courtroom practice where lawyers must respond instantaneously to judicial queries, counter opposing arguments without preparation, and present their case with clarity and conviction. By removing the advantage of extensive preparation, the competition reveals not just what participants know, but how effectively they can synthesize information, identify core issues, construct logical frameworks, and communicate with confidence and eloquence; competencies that distinguish exceptional lawyers from merely competent ones.

Beyond individual skill assessment, this competition serves broader pedagogical and developmental objectives aligned with the event's overarching vision. The impromptu nature of the challenge encourages participants to engage deeply with contemporary legal and social issues, ensuring they maintain awareness of current debates surrounding access to justice, legal aid reform, constitutional rights, and social equity. The bilingual format; accommodating both Hindi and English, recognizes India's linguistic diversity and emphasizes that legal advocacy must transcend language barriers to serve all citizens effectively. This component develops presentation skills, builds confidence in public speaking, sharpens quick analytical thinking, and cultivates the ability to communicate complex legal concepts accessibly, all essential attributes for lawyers committed to public service. Ultimately, the extempore competition reinforces the event's core mission: nurturing a generation of legally astute, socially conscious, and communication-savvy professionals equipped to bridge the gap between legal ideals and lived realities.
