To seek the approval of Academic Council in regard to the Degrees, which may be conferred in-person and Degrees conferred in absentia in the First Convocation of the University scheduled to be held on 19th October 2004.

The Council resolved that the following categories of students may be awarded degrees in person at the scheduled convocation:

- All students who have qualified for the award of Ph.D. degree of the University.
- Students of Post graduate degree programmes of the year 2003 and year 2004, who have qualified and would be present on the occasion.
 - 3. Gold medals to all toppers of the University, the list of which shall be provided by the Controller of Examination and would be approved by the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor.

It was decided to procure gold medals bearing University insignia, of 5 gms. having 99.9% purity, duly certified by the MMTC, which would be embedded in a silver round sheet of 2" diameter.

The remaining students who have qualified for award of degrees of post-graduate/ under-graduate programmes may be awarded degrees in absentia.

To approve the addition of 'Minimum qualifications and experience required for teaching posts in degree level institution conducting Hotel Management and Catering Technology programme' in the approved 'Ordinance relating to recognition of teachers'.

The Council resolved to approve the minimum qualifications and experience which was notified by AICTE for the programme of Bachelor's degree in Hotel Management and Catering Technology in August 2004.

The Council adopted these qualifications and desired to be added to the appendices to the Ordinance relating to recognition of teachers, already approved by the Board of Management.

Further the ordinance related to recognition of teachers, as referred above, will be made operative for recognition of teachers as well as approving the qualified teachers.

Institute of Management Technology, Ghaziabad, which came into being in 1980 had requested the University for granting it the status of an 'Approved Research Centre' under clause 4(a) of the ordinance relating to award of Ph.D.

The Institute had provided the following infrastructural details and academic facilities.

Establishment & Infrastructure

(i) Institute of Management Technology (IMT), being run by Lajpat Rai Educational Society, was

Admissions

Research and Consultancy

The Institute had provided following academic and infrastructural details:-

The National Institute of Communicable Diseases was established in 1963 by Gove of India to function as a National centre of excellence for disease control. The function of the institute included the areas of training and research in various aspects of communicable diseases and their control using multi-disciplinary integrated approach. The institute was, in addition expected to provide expertise to the States and Union Territories (UTs) on rapid health assessment and laboratory based diagnostic services.

Organization:

The Institute is under the administrative control of the Director General of Health Services, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of Increa. The institute has its headquarters in Delhi and has examt out-station branches located at Alwar (Rajasthan). Hangalore (Karnataka), Calicut (Kerala), Coonoor (Tarnil Nadu), Jagdalpur (Chattisgarh), Patna (Bihar), Zajahmundry (Andhra Pradesh) and Varanasi (Uttar Praniesh). There are eight

technical Divisions at the headquarters of the institute viz. HIV/AIDS, Vector Control, Microbiology, Training & Malariology, and Zoonosis.

Objectives of the Institute:

The mandates of the Institute broadly cover three areas viz. services, training and research.

- a. <u>Services</u>: The Institute provides various referral services and technical support to individual patients, community, medical colleges, research institutions and state health directorates.
- b. Training Academic Programme
 - i. Trained Health Manpower Development

Training Special emphasis is given to trained health man-power development that is essential for the successful implementation of different health programmes in the country. Besides the regular training programmes, numerous shortterm training activities are conducted every year. these training course curricula oſ programmes are designed to develop the necessary need-based skills. The participants to these courses come from different States/Union Territories of India including medical colleges. In addition, trainees from some of the neighbouring countries like Bangladesh, Bhutan, Sri Lanka, Myanmar and Nepal also participate in some of the training programmes.

Research

(i) Applied integrated research in various aspects of communicable diseases has been one of the prime functions of the Institute. To achieve this, the institute is actively engaged in research in the following areas. .

- (ii) Applied research in the field of bacteriology, virology, mycology, eco-epidemiology, immunology, parasitology and quality testing of vaccines and other biologicals with an aim of improving diagnostic capabilities of diseases of public health importance and giving laboratory support to the investigation and control of disease out breaks.
- (iii) Molecular studies on epidemiology of wild polio viruses, genotyping of hepatitis B Virus, molecular characterization by PCR and sequencing of specified genes of HIV-1 virus, Dengue virus, Yersinia pestis, Bacillus anthracis, Klebsiella pneumoniae O139 cholerae and monitoring of drug resistance mutation in RT and Protease genes of HIV-1
 - (iv)Laboratory and field oriented research in the bioecology and transmission dynamics or arthropod vectors with the ultimate objective of vector control.
 - (v) Evaluation of new formulations of insecticides and biocides and screening of indigenous herbs to evaluate their insecticidal properties.
 - (vi) In-vitro cultures of malarial parasites, development of diagnostic reagents including monoclonals using modern equipment with the latest techniques.
 - (vii)Studies on biological hazards of pesticides.
 - (viii)Research on hormonal disorders, particularly thyroid disorders.

In order to meet the requirement of the Scheme of Examination/ Syllabi, it was also felt essential to bring about following amendments in the various clauses of the University's ordinance relating to conduct and evaluation of examination leading to all Bachelor's degrees following the Annual system of Examination.

CLAUSE 9:-

Existing:-

ATTENDANCE

A student shall be required to have a minimum attendance of 75% or more in the aggregate of all the courses taken together in an Academic year, provided that the Dean of the school in case of University Schools and Principal/Director in case of University maintained /affiliated institutes may condone attendance shortage upto 5% for individual student for reasons to be recorded. However, under no condition, a student who has an aggregate attendance of less that 70% in an Academic year shall be allowed to appear in the Annual examination.

Revised:-

ATTENDANCE

A student shall be required to have a minimum attendance of 7.5% or more in the aggregate of all the courses taken together in an Academic year, provided that the Dean of the school in case of University Schools and Principal/Director in case of University maintained /affiliated institutes may condone attendance shortage upto 5% for individual student for reasons to be recorded. However, under no condition, a student who has an aggregate attendance of less that 70% in an Academic year shall be allowed to appear in the Annual examination.

Provided that irrespective of the conditions laid down above, students of B.Sc. (Hons.)
