Today IMT offers 20 programmes and there are over 9000 students (Full Time and Distance Learning) currently enrolled in the various programmes.</p> <p>Admissions</p> <p>Till the academic year 2004-05, IMT used to have its own independent all India level entrance test for the admission to its full time Programmes. <p>To apprise the Academic Council of the 'Grant of status of an Approved Research Centre to the National Institute of Communicable Diseases'.</p> <p>National Institute of Communicable Diseases (NICD) had requested the University to consider the case for granting to it the status of an 'Approved Research Centre' under clause 4(a) of the ordinance relating to the award of Ph.D. degree.</p> <p>The Institute had provided following academic and infrastructural details:-</p> <p>The National Institute of Communicable Diseases was established in 1963 by Govt. of India to function as a National centre of excellence for disease control. The function of the institute included the areas of training and research in various aspects of communicable diseases and their control using multi-disciplinary integrated approach. The institute was, in addition expected to provide expertise to the States and Union Territories (UTs) on rapid health assessment and laboratory based diagnostic services.</p> <p>Organization:</p> <p>The Institute is under the administrative control of the Director General of Health Services, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of India. The institute has its headquarters in Delhi and has eight out-station branches located at Alwar (Rajasthan), Bangalore (Karnataka), Calicut (Kerala), Coonoor (Tamil Nadu), Jagdalpur (Chattisgarh), Patna (Bihar), Rajahmundry (Andhra Pradesh) and Varanasi (Uttar Pradesh). HIV/AIDS, Vector Control, Microbiology, Training & Malariology, and Zoonosis.</p> <p>Objectives of the Institute:</p> <p>The mandates of the Institute broadly cover three areas viz. services, training and research.</p> <p>a. <u>Services</u> : The Institute provides various referral services and technical support to individual patients, community, medical colleges, research institutions and state health directorates.</p> <p>b. <u>Training – Academic Programme</u> :</p> <p>i. <u>Trained Health Manpower Development</u></p> <p>Training Special emphasis is given to trained health man-power development that is essential for the successful implementation of different health programmes in the country. Besides the regular training programmes, numerous short-term training activities are conducted every year. (i) To apprise the Academic Council of Scheme of Examination and Syllabi of B.Sc. (Nursing) programme

The Academic Council was apprised of the matter and resolved to confirm the decision taken under subsection 4 of Section 10 of the Act.

(ii) To apprise the Academic Council of the amendment in the ordinance relating to conduct and evaluation of examination for programmes leading to all Bachelor's degree following the annual system of examination.

Lakshmi Bai Batra College of Nursing, Batra Hospital & Medical Research center was granted affiliation for the conduct of B.Sc.(Hons.) Nursing programme of 4 years duration with an intake capacity of 60 students from the academic session 2004-2005.

The scheme of examination and syllabi for the programme, was formulated by a group of experts. The Vice Chancellor, considering the fact that academic session was to commence from 1st August 2004, had approved the scheme of examination and syllabi in exercise of the powers vested in him under sub-section 4 of Section 10 of the Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University Act.

In order to meet the requirement of the Scheme of Examination/ Syllabi, it was also felt essential to bring about following amendments in the various clauses of the University's ordinance relating to conduct and evaluation of examination leading to all Bachelor's degrees following the Annual system of Examination.

CLAUSE 9:-**Existing:-****ATTENDANCE**

A student shall be required to have a minimum attendance of 75% or more in the aggregate of all the courses taken together in an Academic year, provided that the Dean of the school in case of University Schools and Principal/Director in case of University maintained /affiliated institutes may condone attendance shortage upto 5% for individual student for reasons to be recorded. However, under no condition, a student who has an aggregate attendance of less than 70% in an Academic year shall be allowed to appear in the Annual examination.

Revised:-**ATTENDANCE**

A student shall be required to have a minimum attendance of 75% or more in the aggregate of all the courses taken together in an Academic year, provided that the Dean of the school in case of University Schools and Principal/Director in case of University maintained /affiliated institutes may condone attendance shortage upto 5% for individual student for reasons to be recorded. However, under no condition, a student who has an aggregate attendance of less than 70% in an Academic year shall be allowed to appear in the Annual examination.
