

The Council further resolved that : (a) the Scheme of Examinations and Syllabi for B.Tech./M.Tech. (Dual Degree) Computer Science and Engineering programme may be synchronized with the existing B.Tech. (Computer Science and Engineering) and M. Tech. (Computer Science and Engineering) programmes being conducted in other affiliated institutes; (b) The specialization of 'Human Rights Law' be retitled as 'Human Rights and Humanitarian Law' in the case of Master of Laws programme; and (c) the intake in B.Tech./M.Tech. (Dual Degree) Biotechnology programme may be increased to 60 w.e.f. the Academic Session 2007-08.

The Council also resolved that the Vice-chancellor is empowered to approve the Scheme of Examinations and Syllabi for the MBA (Financial Services) – Weekend programme (with facility to specialize in Banking & Insurance) proposed to be introduced by the University School of Management Studies w.e.f. the Academic Session 2006-07...

The Council approved in principle the proposal concerning with the awarding of the degree of B.A. (Law) after the completion of 03 years of study in LL.B (Hons.) programme beside consenting with the Vice-chancellor's proposal for the constitution of an Expert Committee that may workout the modalities and the necessary framework /Scheme of Examinations and Syllabi within which the degree of B.A. (Law) will be awarded.

The Council further approved that at the end of 5 year LL.B (Hons.) programme, the degree carrying the nomenclature 'B.A. (LL.B.) be awarded.

To consider the 'Revised Eligibility Conditions' for admission to MBA and B.Ed. programmes.

The Council, after due deliberations, approved the 'Revised Eligibility Conditions' for MBA and B.Ed. programmes w.e.f the Academic Session 2006-07; these are, as mentioned here under:

Any recognized Bachelor's Degree in any discipline with a minimum of 50% marks in aggregate. OR Bachelor's Degree in Engineering, Technology or any other subject with minimum of 50% marks in aggregate or any qualification recognized as equivalent thereto with minimum of 50% marks in aggregate. OR Passed the Final Examination of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India or England, the Institute of Cost and Works Accountants of India or England or the Institute of Company Secretaries of India.

Bachelor Degree of a recognised University with a minimum of 50% marks in aggregate and having obtained at least 45% marks separately in any two of the listed common school subjects at the bachelor degree level.

Masters' degree in any one of the listed common school subjects from any recognised University with at least 45% marks in aggregate and having obtained at least 45% marks in any other common listed school subject at the graduate level.

This list is provisional and seats will be allotted in the mentioned areas subject to availability of academic facilities in the institutes affiliated to the University. Candidates who have passed M.Com, M.A(Philosophy/Sociology/Psychology) with a minimum of 45% marks in aggregate are also eligible provided they have also obtained at least 45% marks in one of the common listed school subjects listed above at graduation level.

Bachelor Degree of a recognised University with a minimum of 50% marks in aggregate and having obtained at least 50% marks separately in any two of the listed common school subjects at the bachelor degree level, excluding students with the following degrees:

B.Com (Pass/Hons), Bachelor of Journalism (Mass Communication), B.B.A., B.A. (Vocational)

OR

Masters' degree in any one of the listed common school subjects from any recognised University with at least 50% marks in aggregate and having obtained at least 50% marks in any other common listed school subject at the graduate level/post graduate level.

Agenda Item No. 18.7

To consider the creation of Benevolent Fund in the University

The Council considered, deliberated upon at length and resolved to approve the creation of a Benevolent Fund in the University with an appropriate basic amount of money. The details of the purposes and the *modus-operandi* of utilizing this Fund may be worked out by a Committee of Expert that may be constituted by the Vice-chancellor.

The Council further resolved that the University may devise a Scheme wherein Sponsorships from Individuals/Institutions may also be accepted for taking care of some of the purposes to be served from out of the Benevolent Fund.

To consider the Drafts of the Admission Brochure –I and II for the Academic Session 2006-07

The Council considered and approved the Drafts of Admission Brochure-I and II being published for admissions to various programmes for the Academic Session 2006-07. Council empowered the Vice-chancellor to accord approval to Admission Brochure –III to be published for admissions to MBBS programme.

Agenda Item No. 18.9

Any other Item with the permission of the Chair

With an urge to further enhance the University's societal relevance /its connectivity with society, maximize its contribution to the prosperity and welfare of all and provide full opportunity to everyone to exploit their creativity, the Vice-chancellor shared his thought on the introduction of 'Certificate Courses' that could be introduced by the University on weekends (Saturday and Sunday) with minimum of 100 contact hours in subjects which are of interests /potential for enhancement in their income such as Music Appreciation, Yoga, Foreign Languages, Multi-Media, How to be Successful Exporters, Stress Management, etc. Such courses could be floated by any one and/or more than one faculty belonging to the University Schools of Studies/affiliated institutes. Further, the

ce-chancellor also expressed his desire that if a Consortium of Institutes could design such a programme, he would rather welcome the same. For the purpose, he also proposed that a Committee will be constituted to workout the precise nature of the subjects on which such certificate course could be started by the University and he invited all the members of the Council to be a partner of his envisaged programmes.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
