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
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**MINUTES OF THE 32nd MEETING OF THE ACADEMIC COUNCIL HELD ON

At the outset, Vice Chancellor welcomed all members of the **Academic Council (AC)** and informed them about the ongoing academic activities and achievements of the university. He told that this time it was ensured that the 1st counselling for admission to almost all programme could be completed by 31st July, 2012 and the academic session began as per the stipulated schedule of the University i.e., beginning of August, 2012 at the University schools of studies and all affiliated Institutions/ colleges. The University could not compile the exact status of the students admitted to these programmes due to delay in the admissions for the 2nd counselling. This is not under the control of the University as the issuance of approval by the statutory bodies is still awaited in respect of some affiliated institutions /programmes.

He further informed that the overall response of students to admission for various programmes has been very good and the university has launched four new programmes this year at the University Schools of studies. It is observed that there has been a good response of students for admission to M.tech. (Food Technology) and M.Sc. (Natural Resource Management). He elaborated on the good practice of University school of Management studies (USMS) initiated for admission to all of their MBA programmes in which admission has been granted on merit prepared on



the basis of marks obtained in the Common Entrance Examination followed by Interview. He emphasised that this is a practice followed by IIT's and IIM's and is expected that there would be an improvement in the quality of students and it would be appreciated if other Schools are also able to follow it in the years to come. He informed that there was not a very good response for admission to MBA (Disaster Management) and Post Graduate programme in Radiological Physics; however, the programmes have commenced w.e.f academic session 2012-2013.

It was further reported by him that all hostels have become operational and the University is able to provide very good Infrastructure facilities to the inmates. He also informed that in order to vacate the premises of Kashmere Gate campus for Ambedkar University, all schools have been shifted to Dwarka Campus. Only the University school of Architecture and Planning is still continuing to function from the Kashmere Gate Campus. There is a plan to create a campus for Architecture, Planning and Design at Surajmal vihar. Further the Vice Chancellor informed that about 30 faculty members have been recruited for the position of Assistant Prof. and Associate Professors. However, it is observed that there is difficulty in getting good faculty at the senior level.

He was happy to inform that there has been a massive response and approximately 6700 number of applications were received by the University for a Capacity of just 120 seats for PhD Registration at various schools. There are 250 Research scholars as on date but the target is to have at least 400 to 500 Research scholars at all times on the Campus so that substantial research work could be carried out.

The Vice Chancellor informed the council that University has been honoured and it has achieved another milestone i.e Golden Europe Award for quality and commercial prestige certification by Other ways Management Association Paris, France and the University is enriching its quality standards as well as excellence.

Agenda Item No. 32.02 : Action taken report on the proceedings of 31th meeting of the Academic Council held on 02.03.2012

Action taken report of the University on various agenda items of the 31st meeting of the Academic council was discussed and the members were satisfied in respect of the follow up action being taken. However, it was informed that Inter-University migration is not a matter of choice and is a provision allowed only under special circumstances for which reasons must be genuine and clearly explicit. Accordingly, guidelines for revision of existing norms are being framed in the light of suggestions given by the academic council. In case of




medical reasons, advice of the medical board will be taken into consideration besides adequate documentary proof for the same.

It was also informed to the council that the University has made itself ready for assessment by NACC, UGC but as the process of admission/counselling is going on these days, their team will come in the month of October. All requirements have been fulfilled and each and every component of the University is in a mode of preparation.



The Vice Chancellor explained the requirement of the proposed amendment and accordingly the council approved for the same with minor changes as detailed below.



Agenda Item No.32.08:


To ratify the approved scheme and syllabus of M.Ed. & B.Ed. programme recommended by the Sub-Committee of Academic Council of the concerned school.

The council ratified the Scheme of Examination and Syllabus of M.Ed. & B.Ed. programme implemented w.e.f., Academic Session 2012-2013, with the prior approval of Vice Chancellor. However, the Dean assured to take care of the suggestions given by one of the members regarding conduct of practical examinations as per the schedule/ academic calendar for B.Ed. programme in the light of semester system being introduced recently. It was also informed that a new programme in B.Ed.(Special education) is under process.

Agenda Item No.32.09:

To appraise about Admission of Mr. Vaibhav Arora in B.Tech. Programme in 3rd year on account of Visa Denial for going to Auburn University, U.S.A. for completing 3rd and 4th year.

The University had signed an agreement with Auburn University, U.S.A. which was running a twinning B.Tech. programme at Maharaja Agrasen Institute of Technology(MAIT) and Mr. Vaibhav Arora (student of this programme) being denied



of visa for going to Auburn University, U.S.A. for completing 3rd and 4th year was to continue his studies at MAIT as per hon'ble Court's order. To allow him for such arrangement, the university had constituted an expert committee which suggested pursuance and clearance of eight additional papers in B.Tech. Computer Science and Engineering programme.

The council deliberated on the recommendations of the expert committee and under the circumstances the matter of pursuance of B.Tech. Computer Science and Engineering programme by Mr. Vaibhav Arora now falls in the jurisdiction of the University affiliated institute. Hence it is the responsibility of the University to ensure that sanctity of the programme being pursued by the candidate is maintained and for the purpose additional courses are mandatory to be cleared by the student.

The Council further suggested that the criteria of **credit transfer** may be applied in respect of the courses which have already been cleared by the candidate and taught by faculty from Auburn University, USA at MAIT. It was also suggested that the choice of completing the mandatory requirement of clearing the additional papers be left to the student and the university should not have any objection if the student is able to pass the said B.Tech. Programme as per the norms of the university.

Agenda Item No.32.10:


To appraise about Rescheduling of Semester Examination for BBA (IHM) students of Ashok Institute of Hospitality & Tourism Management.

The Council took note of the information provided regarding decision taken by the Vice Chancellor in this respect.

Agenda Item No.32.11

To consider the enhancement of Indraprastha Research Fellowship.

The council, in the light of Clause – 20 of Amended Ordinance 12, -“Governing Programmes Leading to Degree of Doctor of Philosophy,” approved for enhancement of fellowship from Rs. 12,000/- p.m. to Rs. 14,000/- p.m. and after two years from Rs. Rs. 14,000/- p.m. to Rs. 16,000/- p.m. w.e.f. 1st September, 2012 as proposed for research fellows of the university. It was also informed to the council that the university is in the process of working out a plan for implementation of postdoctoral fellowship in future.



Agenda item No: 32.12 To consider the relaxation in respect of depositing the fee (with late fee) granted to the scholars admitted to the Ph.D Programme in the year 2010.

The council deliberated on the issue and resolved that established norms and guidelines framed by the university should be followed in letter and spirit in general to maintain a degree of sanctity and discipline.

However, in case of any eventuality, the Council authorised the Vice Chancellor to take appropriate decision.

Agenda item No: 32.13 To consider the counting of workload for directed courses and supervision of Ph.D scholars.

To streamline the workload of the faculty involved in various academic activities Faculty Appraisal and Development System (FADS) had been evolved. In line with this, payment for additional workload had also to be streamlined. Accordingly, the proposal under the item has been approved by the council so that uniformity in implementation of the same could be maintained by all concerned. This will be implemented prospectively

To consider the proposal for introduction of new/ innovative academic programme in the Centre of Excellence in Pharmaceutical Sciences.

The Academic Council deliberated on the subject at length and resolved that a committee of experts may be constituted as a matter of practice so that thorough examination about the feasibility for smooth conduct of any new programme and acceptability of such programmes by students and their placement after obtaining the degree could be worked out in a more rational and analytical manner. It was further suggested that the University should look into minute details so as to evolve a more systematic approach before launching any new programme.

Agenda item No: 32.16

To consider the amendment in Regulation No. 2 of Ordinance-12, dealing with the procedure of admission in Ph.D Programme.

The council discussed on the subject at length and considered views presented by Deans of various schools. It was felt by the council that flexibility of merit on final selection should not be allowed and once the merit is prepared for admission to a program, it should be followed. Each school should prepare proper slot for admission of students in PhD programme as per availability of guides/supervisors for particular subjects/fields, so that a student is not denied a seat for admission in PhD Programme after qualifying the prescribed criteria, when his/her name is shown in the final merit list.

Keeping in view the variability of the programs, it was decided by the council that first let all Deans have a meeting to resolve issues arising due to variability of the programs/subjects so that a more rational method of evaluation could be worked out for implementation.



Agenda item No: 32.17

To approve the Proforma for six monthly progress report of finally registered research scholars for admission in PhD Programme.

The council approved the proposal according to which registered students shall be required to submit their 6 monthly progress reports (at least 4 during the period of pursuance of PhD programme) to the respective Dean through their supervisor/Guide. The School Research Committee of the respective school shall monitor the academic research progress of each registered scholar and submit a report to this effect for information of the Vice Chancellor and a record of Director Research and Consultancy.

Agenda item No: 32.18

To approve the non allocation of grace marks to Ph.D scholars in the End-Term Theory Examination of Core Courses.

The council resolved that no grace marks shall be awarded in any examination of Ph.D course work as PhD Degree is the highest degree of the University and only 12(twelve) marks in total are required to be obtained in the four courses offered in two semesters.


To consider the request of two research scholars admitted in 2010 for relaxation of not-submitting the annual fee on time for the year 2011.

Agenda Item No. 32.22:


To consider and approve the panel of subject experts for all academic purposes/activities.

The council approved the consolidated database of the proposed panel of subject experts for carrying out various academic activities and for all academic purposes like Selection committees for the faculty / research fellows, participation as experts, etc. The committee further suggested that proper editing of the database may be carried out. To consider and approve the list of journals (No. 10641) to facilitate research scholars, faculty members /supervisors /joint supervisors for academic activities/ research purposes.


The council considered and approved the consolidated list of 10641 journals based on parameters like Impact factor, abstracted and refereed **National/ International journals** as proposed.
