The action taken by the University on various agenda items of 32nd meeting of Academic Council have been approved, however, it was suggested that recommendations of the expert committee constituted for framing the guidelines for revision of existing norms of **Migration of students** may be circulated to all concerned and another committee be constituted to look into the Ordinance once again to resolve the issues involved.

The members also suggested for starting twinning programmes at the University schools also as have been launched at one of its affiliated institutions. Principals of affiliated institutions present there requested that the University may also help the affiliated institutions to be placed under provision of 12 b of the UGC and obtaining accreditation by it.

- First Division with Distinction: A candidate obtaining a CPI at the end of the programme of 75 and above shall be placed in First Division with Distinction, provided, the candidate has passed all the courses for which he has earned credits, in the first attempt. Further, a candidate obtaining a CPI of 90 and above shall be deemed to have passed programme with the exemplary performance provided he/she has passed all the courses for which he has earned the credits, in the first attempt. Such candidates will be awarded a special University Certificate to this effect.
- Cumulative Performance Index (CPI) shall be calculated as in Clause 14 and shall be based only on marks obtained in courses for which credits have been earned.
 N.B- The amendment will be applicable only on completion of

the programme when the result is compiled for calculating the CPI.

The proposed amendment in the Ordinance 30 and the said (related) Regulation will come into force with effect from Academic session 2013-14 for admissions made under the Defence category.

Agenda Item No. 33.07:

To consider and approve the recommendations of the expert committee constituted to examine about the Feasibility for conduct of any new/ innovative Academic programme in the Centre of excellence in Pharmaceutical Sciences.

The recommendations of expert committee to examine the feasibility for conduct of any new/ innovative Academic programme in the Centre of excellence in Pharmaceutical Sciences and to evolve a more systematic approach for launching it were deliberated at length by the Academic council. The Academic Council approved the proposal and offered following suggestions:

(a) Prof. N.K. Chaturvedi, Advisor PGIMER, Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Hospital advised that there are lots of legal and bioethical issues involved in conducting programmes which involve research / experiments on animals/plants and prior permission from the relevant Government bodies is mandatory to be acquired.

- (b) The members opined that designing a drug and developing it for purposeful function(s) is a long drawn process, however, in principle it was resolved that the M.Pharma. programme may be launched after initiating the centre for which budget has been allotted and space/ infrastructure earmarked.
- (c) It was emphasized that necessary clearances from the Ministry of Drugs and Chemicals and other statutory bodies should be obtained before any experimental or research work is initiated. The scheme of examination and syllabus of the program to be launched will have to be designed through constitution of an expert committee.
- (d) Other members further advised that experts at CDRI and ITRC, Lucknow (U.P) may be consulted to work out the priorities before starting any research programme. It was also advised that to begin with research activities, the centre may focus on synthesis of medicinal plant products to initiate and later add other important molecules / Drugs in times to come when better facilities are being created.
