At the outset, the Vice Chancellor greeted all members of the Academic Council and after formal introduction he intimated that the Academic and the Administrative staff are all geared up for the coming session. He informed that the admission brochures have already been announced and this time the University has published two kinds of consolidated brochures, one for all under graduate and post graduate programmes except engineering and Architecture and the other exclusively for all Engineering and Architecture programmes. He further added that this innovation is unlike the previous years, when the University used to publish separate brochures for different streams and will definitely facilitate students to have a comprehensive view about the similar programmes being conducted at the University schools and its affiliated institutions.

**Agenda Item No. 34.01 : To confirm minutes of the 33<sup>rd</sup> meeting of Academic Council held on 26.11.2012.**

The Academic Council confirmed the minutes of the 33<sup>rd</sup> meeting held on 26.11.2012.

**Agenda Item No. 34.02 : Action taken report on the proceedings of 33<sup>rd</sup> meeting of the Academic Council held on 26.11.2012**

The Council confirmed action taken by the University on various agenda items of 33<sup>rd</sup> meeting; however, it had some suggestions on various items. It was decided that the University will maintain status quo in respect of the existing norms for Migration of students. Pending work related to issuance of degrees will be expedited and the COE will ensure that all degrees remaining for past years are sent to the respective affiliated colleges within 3 months.

In respect of agenda item 33.05, the Council suggested that Dean USE may take appropriate action before the end of April regarding change of nomenclature of B.Ed. Special Education programme so that exams could be conducted accordingly.

The council in addition to the approval granted in respect of Agenda item 33.09 for issuance of equivalence certificates to pass out students in respect of B.Tech(MAE.)



and B.Tech. (ME) Programme for the purpose of Employment and advancement of Education, further resolved that-

1. Letters will be written to HR Manager of all corporations.
2. A Committee of Experts to be constituted to look into the matter.
3. Letter to the Bureau of Public sector enterprises.

The council also suggested that it must be ensured by the University that the degree granted/ awarded to the students is recognised for employment and further Education by Govt. organisations, other Public sector undertakings and other Corporations.

Prof. S.C. Dutta Roy suggested that the University must grant a degree that should be broad based always and the specialization should be introduced in a manner that it benefits the students in their placements. He further opined that mentioning the specialization at the UG Degree level is inappropriate and for dual degrees it must be intelligently incorporated in the nomenclature so that students get benefited and it does not restrict the avenues for placement.

**Agenda Item No.34.03:**

To consider and approve partial -amendment of Ordinance 16: Conduct and evaluation of examinations leading to post graduate diplomas, post graduate Degrees (MD/MS Doctor of Medicine/ Master of Surgery) and post Doctoral Degrees (D.M./ M.Ch. : Directorate in Medicine/ Magister of Chirurgiae)

f. The training programme for award of the mentioned Post Graduate degrees should include :

i. **M.D./M.S.(Doctor of Med. /Master of Surgery)**

- Basic medical sciences : Lectures, seminars, journal clubs, group discussions, laboratory and experimental work, exposure to applied aspects of the specialty and involvement in research studies.

- Clinical disciplines : during the training, the students should be given independent responsibility in management of patients, participation in seminars, journal clubs, group discussions, clinical meetings, clinico-pathological conferences and training in allied disciplines.

ii. **D.M./MCh. (Doctorate in Medicine/ Magister of Chirurgiae)**

- Training for the students registered in the above course shall be in the same pattern as for M.D./M.S. Training should include practical training in advanced diagnostic, therapeutic and laboratory techniques relevant to the subject. For MCh candidates, there should be participation in surgical operations as an assistant and independently.

iii. **Diplomas**

- Training of candidates registered in the said course would be on the same lines as for M.D./M.S., however, the duration of training would be of two years only. Also they would not be required to undertake a thesis study.

### **13.0 EVALUATION**

a. The examiner in the practical examination should follow a system of objectively structured practical examination (OSPE) and objectively structured clinically examination (OSCE).

b. OSPE and OSCE are structured methods of examination which enables the examiner to assess all the aspects of learning and training separately. It is a

<p>more objective and reliable method of testing a large number of students. However, the system requires greater effort, time and team work. OSCE also test inter personnel skills of clinical examination and practical procedures. There is also a potential to include more number of junior examiners. OSCE and OSPE are more demanding on examiners and patients.</p> <p>c. With the intent to include OSPE and OSCE there will be four examiners, two internal and two external for the examination. The internal examiners would include a professor. The other examiners included may be other faculty members by rotation.</p>	
<p><b>15.0 EXAMINATIONS</b></p> <p>a. Examinations for the Post Graduate programmes shall be organised on the basis of a system to evaluate the candidate's level of knowledge, skill and competence at the end of the training. The student is required to obtain a minimum of 50% marks in theory as well as in practical's separately for passing the examination. The examinations for M.D., M.S., D.M., MCh shall be held at the end of three academic years and for diploma programmes the examination will be held after two academic years.</p> <p>b. Diploma programmes will have a maximum of 600 marks i.e. maximum of 300 marks for theory and 300 marks for practicals respectively. 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**Agenda Item No.34.04:**

**To consider and approve the Annual Report of the University for the academic session 2010-2011 and 2011-2012**

The council opined that the annual reports of the University for the **Academic Session 2010-2011 and 2011-2012** are okay, however, there is scope for improvement and in future, a better quality annual report could be prepared. Prof. Uppeandar Dhar suggested that the tables may be changed to graphics and financial health of the University may be categorically incorporated. He further suggested that designations may not be mentioned while indicating the publications of the faculty. The council also suggested that as a mark of improvement uniformity could be maintained while detailing the growth profile of various schools. It was also recommended that the University may also add the achievements of the affiliated institutions in future to make it more inclusive.

**Agenda Item No.34.05:**

**To consider and approve the scheme and syllabi of B.Tech. / M.Tech. dual degree programme in Bio-Chemical Engineering to commence from Academic session 2013-14 under the University School of Chemical Technology.**

The council approved for the scheme and syllabi of B.Tech., M.Tech dual degree Programme of 6 years (4+2)duration to comments w.e.f., 2013-2014, however, wanted to know about the advantages to students in respect of grant of degree. It was informed by the Chairman that students who would like to pursue only B.Tech. Programme will be awarded B.Tech. Degree and those who would like to continue, will get an opportunity to pursue M.Tech. Programme without undergoing CET. The Dean also informed that the Programme already has a statutory body approval for its nomenclature.

**Agenda Item No. 34.06:**

**To consider and ratify the approval granted by the Vice Chancellor for modification in the scheme and syllabi of B.Ed. Special Education (MR) implemented w.e.f. session: 2012-13.**

The Council ratified the approval granted by the Vice Chancellor on the basis of the recommendations of the sub-committee of the Academic council for B.Ed.

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Special Education (MR) programme being conducted w.e.f., 2012-2013. However, it was resolved that difficulties pointed out by one of the members in respect of implementation of the programme, should be resolved separately by the Board of Studies of the School of Education.

**Agenda Item No. 34.07:**

**To consider and ratify the approval granted by the Vice Chancellor for modification in the scheme and syllabi of various M.Tech. programmes implemented w.e.f. session: 2012-13**

It was pointed out by some members that programme like VLSI Design, Signal processing, RF and microwave Engineering and Digital communication are offshoots of abroad based programme of M.Tech. Electronics and Communication and in order to ensure placement of students, the matter needs further deliberation of the subject experts. Hence, the matter may be decided in the next academic council after the recommendations of the experts.

**Agenda Item No. 34.08:**

**To consider the case of Ms Ankita Arora pursuing B.A LLB 3<sup>rd</sup> year from Amity Law School, F-I Block, sector – 125, Noida, UP, regarding migration to Vivekanand Institute of Professional Studies, AU Block (outer Ring Road), Pitampura, New Delhi affiliated to this University.**

The Council in principle did not recommend for approval of such a request as it was a departure from the existing ordinance. It opined that the student had a high rank in CET and she could have taken admission in Vivekanand Institute of Professional Studies, instead of Amity Law School, where she has been attending classes for the last two years. However, considering the case, the Vice Chancellor was authorised to take appropriate decision in the interest of the University after taking advice of the legal counsel and future repercussion to be quoted as precedence of migration in 5<sup>th</sup> / 6<sup>th</sup> semester.



**Agenda Item No.34.09:**

**To ratify the approval granted by the Vice Chancellor for the Scheme and Syllabi of B.Arch. Programme (1<sup>st</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup> year) implemented with effect from academic session 2012-2013.**

The council ratified the decision of the Vice Chancellor on the basis of the recommendations of the sub-committee of the Academic council, for the scheme and syllabi of B.Arch Programme implemented from the respective session.

**Agenda Item No.34.10:**

**To consider and approve for conduct of Post Graduate Diploma in Educational Leadership and Management programme in the weekend mode w.e.f., academic session 2013-14 at University school of Education.**

The council approved for conduct of Post Graduate Diploma in Educational Leadership and Management programme in the weekend mode w.e.f., academic session 2013-14 at University school of Education for the present session. However, it was suggested that the same may continue in future based on the outcome of response of the stakeholders.

**Agenda Item No.34.11:**

**To ratify the approval granted by the Vice Chancellor for registration of Ms. Ganga Sharma, PhD. Scholar w.e.f., 03.10.2012, under the School of Information Technology.**

The council ratified the approval granted by the Vice Chancellor for registration of Ms. Ganga Sharma, for pursuing P.hD w.e.f., 3.10.2012 (date of approval by the Board of Studies) under the said school.

**Agenda Item No.34.12:**

**To ratify the approval granted by the Vice Chancellor for revised course curriculum of BDS programme and its duration as per norms of the Dental Council of India.**

The Council ratified the approval granted by Vice Chancellor on the basis of the recommendations of the sub-committee of the Academic council for revised course



curriculum of Bachelor of Dental Surgery (BDS) programme and its duration as per norms of Delhi Council of India (DCI).

**Table agenda Item No.34.13:** To ratify the partial modifications in the scheme and syllabi of M.Tech. (Food Processing Technology) programme being conducted w.e.f. session 2012-13.

The council ratified the approval granted by the Vice Chancellor in respect of partial modifications in the scheme and syllabi of M.Tech. (Food Processing Technology) programme being conducted w.e.f. session 2012-13. The council only approved the NUES for 5 credits in the odd semester. However, it suggested that other proposed modifications must be discussed in the Board of studies of the school which should come up with recommendations for consideration of the next Academic council.
