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

At the outset, the Vice Chancellor welcomed the members present in the meeting. Member Secretary Brig. P.K. Upmanyu presented the Agenda Items.

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Agenda Item No. AC 46.01: To confirm minutes of the 45th meeting of the Academic Council held on 19.03.2019.

The proceedings of the 45th meeting of the Academic Council held on 19.03.2019 were sent to all members for consideration and comments. No comments / observations have been received.

At the time of discussion on Agenda Item No. AC 46.01 to confirm the proceeding of 45th minutes of Academic Council, the member secretary requested the members to kindly deliberate upon the Agenda Item No. AC 45.18 which reads as "To consider and approve the recommendations of the committee duly constituted by the Vice Chancellor to holistically review the process of Upgradation / Branch Change, and Migration from Academic Session 2019-2020 onwards".

It was informed to all the members that the Agenda Item No. AC 45.18 was approved by the Academic Council in its 45th meeting held on 19.03.2019 and thereafter the same was also placed before the Board of Management vide Agenda Item No. BM 68.05 in its meeting held on 05.04.2019.

It was also informed to the members that implementation has many technical difficulties in respect of the said Agenda Item No. AC 45.18 which was approved in the Academic Council and also thereafter approved in the Board of Management as Agenda Item No. BM 68.05 and therefore the same needs to be reviewed. Some of the reasons which were highlighted are as given below:

It was informed that as per Agenda Item No. AC 45.05 (BOM Agenda No. BM 68.05) the process of up-gradation/change of stream has to be completed by 31st May every year. Due to procedural difficulties, the University could not commence the process of upgradation / change of stream even as on date and therefore with the present approved agenda none of the existing students in the university will be able to benefit from the said provisions.

It was also informed that as per the approved agenda item No. AC 45.05 (BOM Agenda Item No. BM 68.05) the students will be considered for upgradation / change of stream on the basis of merit in CET (Common Entrance Test). As per the previous provisions which were amended in Agenda Item No. AC 45.05 (BOM Agenda Item No. BM 68.05) the merit used to be prepared on the basis of his / her first semester marks. The upgradation / change of stream on the basis of CET will result in discrimination as those who have done better in the CET and availed the benefit of the merit in admission in first semester would get benefit twice. This provision of making merit on the basis of CET even in third semester will also be discriminatory as the reserve category student who have got the admission in reserve category even being in low in rank in CET would always be at disadvantage as there is no reservation for reserve category in the process of upgradation / change of stream. This CET provisions will also be discriminatory to the students admitted in the management quota seat.

It was further informed that as per the same resolution the vacancies arrive after 20th April, 2019 shall not be considered for the purpose of up-gradation/change of Scheme. However, those vacancies if available after 20th April, 2019 will either go for the migration if permitted or will remain vacant throughout the three year period.

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The matter was discussed in detail and all the members unanimously decided that the Vice Chancellor may be authorized to review the procedure and process in the interest of the students. It was also decided that the Agenda Item No. AC 45.05 already approved by the Academic Council needs to be reviewed to ensure all the above issues are looked into. All the members unanimously decided to state that till new regulations are framed after detailed deliberations the old existing regulations shall continue to be followed for the purpose of upgradation/change of stream. The members deliberated on the issue of 5% upper limit of seats for the purpose of ugradation / change of stream in the old existing regulations and unanimously approved that the old existing regulations should continue to be used however the upgradation / change of stream within the same institute by student should be carried out by removing the 5% upper limit of the existing vacant seats.

The Academic Council authorized the Vice Chancellor to inform the Board of Management about the said resolution and the minutes of the Academic Council.

Accordingly the proceedings of its 45^{th} meeting of Academic Council were confirmed by the Council.



Statutory approval of opening new course or changes in the curriculum and scheme of examination of existing courses prior to the publication of admission brochure.

The Academic Council approved that no new course or existing course or modified course shall be launched till all the statutory approvals pertaining to its scheme and curriculum are duly notified and incorporated in the admission brochure for the forthcoming academic session.

Important Notification regarding Priorities in Defence Categories for Academic Session 2019-20.

The Academic Council considered and approved the revised list of priorities in Defence categories for Academic Session 2019-2020 as per the notifications.

Agenda Item No. AC 46.29:

Implementation of 10% reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) for academic session 2019-20 as mentioned in No. DHE.1(119)/Estt./2018-19/2549-76 dated 17.06.2019 from Admin Officer (HE) Directorate of Higher Education, enclosed with another letter No. F No: 12-4/2019-U1 dated 17.01.2019 from Director Govt. of India, Department of Higher Education Ministry of Human Resource Development.

The Academic Council ratified the implementation of EWS for admission to various programmes / courses as per the letter received from DHE dated 17.06.2019 and the details mentioned in agenda w.e.f. Academic Session 2019-2020.

Few programmes which had declared to be held online but held as Offline due time bound of statutory body guidelines for academic session 2019-20.

The Academic Council ratified the decision taken regarding few programmes which were declared to be conducted online but were held Offline due to time bound nature of statutory body guidelines, for academic session 2019-20.

The Academic Council deliberated on the Agenda and it was unanimously decided that the clarification regarding allocation of seats in each programme or each institute may be sought from the Government and empower the Vice Chancellor to take decision in the matter.

Agenda Item No. AC 46.35:

To consider and approve amendment in clause 11.3(vi) of Ordinance 10 and 11 pertaining to Final Year Supplementary End Term Examinations.

The Academic Council considered and decided the following amendments in the clause 11.3(vi) of Ordinance 10 and 11:-

Ordinance 11 clause 11.3 (vi) Supplementary End Term Examinations
The supplementary examinations to be held for all courses of odd semesters in the
month of June-July for the students who have completed final year of studies but
who have failed in any course (s) of odd semesters.

The supplementary examinations of all courses of even semesters for the students who have completed final year of studies but who have failed in any course (s) of even semesters shall be conducted after the declaration of the even semesters result preferably in the month of August – September.

The teachers' continuous evaluation components shall not change in these cases. The supplementary end term examinations shall be held for programmes of studies whose syllabi and Scheme of Teaching and Examination specify this examination.

Ordinance 10 clause 11.3 (vi) Supplementary End Term Examinations

The supplementary examinations of all courses for the students who have completed final year of studies but who have failed in any course(s) of any annual exam, shall be conducted after the declaration of the result preferably in the month of August – September.

The teachers' continuous evaluation components shall not change in these cases. The supplementary end term examinations shall be held for programmes of studies whose syllabi and Scheme of Teaching and Examination specify this examination.

Agenda Item No. AC 46.36:

Regarding non receipt of verification of NOC and other documents of the lending University in respect of candidates applied for Inter University Migration for Academic Session 2018-19

The GGSIP University had notified inviting application for Migration in the Academic Session 2018-19 as per the Ordinance No.7: Migration of Students as per approval of Competent Authority. For Inter University Migration 230 Students have applied for Migration in GGSIP University and on the recommendation of Committee constituted by Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, 37 cases were approved on the basis of the reasons submitted and other cases were not approved. The candidates whose requests for Migration were not accepted by the GGSIP University went to the Court of law and filed Writ Petition in the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi, New Delhi.

The Hon'ble High Court vide its order dated 07.01.2019 directed for the migration submitted by petitioners. In the said order, it was also stated that these directions also cover the petitioners, if any, in respect of whom verification of the documents submitted by them is still under process. If, however, on such verification, the petitioners are found ineligible for migration, or any lack of bonafides is found, in the application of any of the petitioners, this judgment shall not preclude the GGSIPU from cancelling / withdrawing the permission for migration, granted by this judgment. Needless to say, in any such eventuality, the rights of any student / students, which may be prejudicially affected, to challenge the decision, would remain saved.

It is for information of the members that verification of the documents submitted by few candidates is still incomplete in spite of best efforts by the University to get verification of documents but no response has been received so far.

It is for information of the members that the University in the absence of verification has rejected the case of migration of such students.

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Agenda Item No. AC 46.37:

Agenda regarding information about decision of the Hon'ble High Court Orders in WP(C) No 12219/2018 titled Ritika Jain Vs. GGS IP University in which the writ petition for change of stream in inter shift migration were rejected.

It is for information for all the members that few students had filed a court case in High Court of Delhi aggrieved by refusal by the University to accept their request for change of stream in inter shift migration. The Hon'ble High Court of Delhi in WP (C) No. 12219/2018 titled Ritika Jain Vs. GGS IP University and other petitions recorded in their order dated 29.05.2019 that all these writ petitions too, therefore, would be liable to be rejected and are accordingly dismissed.

The Hon'ble High Court of Delhi vide para 59 of the Order dismiss the said petitions. The para 60 of the said order is reproduced below: It has not been easy, for this court, to bring itself to pen the above judgment. I am aware of the possibility of the petitioners, in the above writ petitions [as well as Petitioner No.1 in W.P. (C) No.12767.2018], being affected by this judgment, and, possibly, losing a year. In case any such eventuality arises, as the consequence of implementation of this judgment, it is clarified that this judgment would not stand in the way of the GGSIPU, if it deems it so appropriate, to adopt an empathetic approach, in respect of these petitioners, and to permit them to continue in the classes in which they are presently studying, or take any other step to ensure that they do not lose a valuable academic year. Needless to say, this caveat is only in the form of a hope, and a suggestion, and would not detract from the fact that, on merits, all the above writ petitions stand dismissed.

The University after discussions and deliberation had decided not to interfere with the . orders of the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi and has decided to comply with order of the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi denying migration to all such petitioners / applicants.
