The programmes, namely, Master of Human Resource Planning and Development, Master of Archaeology & Heritage Management, Master of Conservation, Preservation & Heritage Management and Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine & Surgery are specialised in nature and are being conducted at a single institution.

Therefore, the Council approved the proposal for conduct of admissions at the institute level on the basis of the marks obtained by the candidates in the qualifying examination.

The Council also authorised the Vice-Chancellor to make minor changes in the above schedule, if necessary, for administrative convenience and to avoid any overlapping of dates for the entrance test of similar programmes conducted by other universities/institutions, particularly those located in Delhi and nearby states.

Regarding the entry qualification for the 5 year B. Arch. programme, Shri P.R. Mehta, President, Council of Architecture has mentioned that the Council of Architecture had recommended 12th class pass with minimum of 50% marks in aggregate with English and Mathematics as compulsory subjects. As B. Arch. is basically a creative programme, Physics & Chemistry subjects are not essential at the 12th standard as an entry qualification for this programme. The Council authorised Vice-Chancellor to take a final decision on the matter in consultation with the President, Council of Architecture and the Directors of the concerned institutions.

Agenda Item No. 6.5: To consider and approve the scheme of Distance Education and Open Learning Approach for implementation

The Vice-Chancellor apprised the members on the necessity to adopt the Distance Education and Open Learning Approach by this University in this era of Information Technology and online networks. The guidelines proposed in the agenda were discussed item-wise and after detailed deliberations, the suggestions made by various members were incorporated and the following guidelines have been approved by the Council for implementation of the scheme of Distance Education and Open Learning Approach:

(i) The University may agree to provide for any programme(s) to be conducted under this scheme. These programmes may preferably be presently available in the University Schools, maintained colleges or affiliated colleges.

- (x) The examination of each course shall be conducted by the University as per the related ordinances and regulations applicable to these programmes with flexibility of minimum prescribed credits to be earned by the students. The examination centres will be region/state-wise.
- (xi) The admissions will be made by the Centres with the prior approval of the University through proper advertisement. The mode of admission and detailed procedure should be specified in the prospectus duly approved by the University. For a management having more than one Centre, common admission procedure may be adopted.
- (xii) The study material for the different programmes under this scheme will be prepared and supplied by the Centres. A copy of such study material should be made available in advance to University for approval.
- (xiii) Approval for each Centre will be given after due inspection/assessment by the University.
- (xiv) The transfer from formal stream of programme to non-formal stream of programme under the Distance Education & Open Learning Approach scheme may be allowed. However, the migration/transfer from non-formal programme under Distance Education and Open Learning Approach to formal pogramme being run in the regular colleges affiliated with this University shall be restricted to 10% of the sanctioned intake and subject to availability of seats in the colleges after the 1st year of their studies. Such migration will be strictly on merit basis for the top ranking students on the basis of their performance in the University examinations.
- (xv) Each Centre will be allowed to conduct the programme after depositing the necessary initial deposit/security amount and seeking approval of the University. The approval will be given on year-to-year basis to conduct such programme/programmes.
- (xvi) A M.O.U shall be singed by the management of the Centre with the University.

Agenda Item No.6.6: To consider and approve the conduct of annual pattern examination for B. Pharma, programme affiliated with this University

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The Council approved the conduct of annual examination for the B.Pharma. programme instead of semester examination as provided in the scheme, as one time relaxation. However, the syllabus already approved by the Academic Council for the B.Pharma. programme of this University shall continue to be followed.

Agenda Item No. 6.7: To consider the recognition of degree of Chartered
Accountant awarded by Institute of Chartered Accountants
of India for admission to the Ph.D. Programme

The Council approved, in principle, awarding of recognition of the Chartered Accountancy course of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India for admission to the Ph.D. programme by this University. However, in order to decide the details regarding the eligibility of the CA course for Ph.D. programme, a committee comprising Prof. O.P. Goyal, Dean, School of Management Studies and Prof. S.N. Maheshwari, Director, Delhi Institute of Advanced Studies was constituted to work out the details and specify the eligibility criteria with the approval of Vice Chancellor. It was also decided that University may request ICAI to allow exemption for some papers of their course to the students of MBA and MCA programmes of this University.

Agenda Item No. 6.8: To approve the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India
Accounting Research Foundation (ICAL ARF) by this
University for its Ph.D. Programme.

The Council considered and approved that the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India Accounting Research Foundation (ICAI ARF) could be recognised as an institute for conducting research work for the Ph.D. programmes of this University, on mutually agreed terms and conditions.

Agenda Item No. 6.9: Rules regarding weeding out of old records of the Examination Division of the University

The Council approved the proposed rules for the weeding out of old records of the University and the same is annexed at pages A-1 to A-4.

Other Items:-

(i) Networking of institutions:

After deliberations, it was decided that in the first phase, the University will take up the work of networking all the engineering institutions and the University. A period of three months has been fixed to complete this job and thereafter networking of all institutions conducting BIS (Hons.) programme will be taken up. Dr. Om Vikas, / Sr. Director, Deptt. of Electronics, Govt. of India has been requested to extend his valuable services in this regard.

(ii) Conferment of title of Professor:

A suggestion was made by Mr. P.R. Mehta, President, Council of Architecture, that eminent professionals in the disciplines relevant to the University be accredited and conferred the title of professors, on their application to this effect. It was desired that this alongwith extending recognition of teachers as Professor/Asstt. Professor may be examined within the provisions of the University Act.

The meeting ended with thanks to the Chair.
