# Agenda Item No. 9.1. To confirm the minutes of the 8<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Academic Council held on 28.07.2001

The minutes of the 8<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Academic Council which had been circulated vide letter dated 17.08.2001 were confirmed.

### Agenda Item No. 9.2. Action Taken Report

The members of the Academic Council noted the action taken on various decisions of the 8<sup>th</sup> meeting and accepted the Action Take Report.

Agenda Item 9.3. To co-opt the members for the Academic Council as per Indraprastha Vishwavidyalaya Act and Statute.

Agenda Item No. 9.4. To approve the Syllabus and Examination Scheme of MBBS programme introduced in the Vardhman Mahavir Medical College - Safdarjang Hospital, New Delhi

Dr. D. Malhotra, Principal, Institute of Rehabilitation Medicine Allied Sciences mentioned some deviations from the Medical Council of India regulations for MBBS



programme and requested that the same be incorporated in the scheme. Vice-Chancellor desired that Dr. Malhotra may examine the syllabus and evaluation scheme of MBBS programme thoroughly and submit his suggestions in writing so that the same may be considered for further action.

The Council after deliberation approved the syllabus and evaluation scheme of MBBS programme of Vardhman Mahavir Medical College, Safdajang Hospital, New Delhi for implementation and also authorized Vice-Chancellor for incorporation of minor modification, if required.

Agenda Item No. 9.5. To approve the Syllabus and Examination Scheme for Bachelor of Technology in Power Engineering.

Council deliberated and approved the syllabus and examination scheme of B.Tech (Power Engineering) conducted in the National Power Training Institute and also authorized Vice-Chancellor to accept minor modifications if required to be incorporated in the syllabus.

Agenda Item No. 9.6. To apprise the Academic Council regarding the schedule of entrance tests, declaration of results and commencement of counselling / admissions as notified in the Information Bulletin for the academic session 2002-2003.

It was observed by the Council that for admissions for the session 2002-2003 the response in most of the programmes is better this year as compared to last year except for IT related programmes. It was informed to the Council that University is strictly adhering to the time schedule notified in the Information Bulletin for admissions to various programmes affiliated to this University. Council noted the information as provided in the agenda.

Agenda Item 9.7: To approve the change of nomenclature of following programmes:-

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- (i) Master of Environment Management to M.Sc. (Environment Management)
- (ii) Master of Software Engineering to MCA (Software Engineering)
- (iii) BCAM to BBA (CAM)
- (iv) B.Tech. (Computer & Communication Engg.) to B.Tech. (Computer Science & Engg.) and B.Tech. (Electronics & Electrical Engg.) to B.Tech. (Electronics & Communication Engg.) in Mahila Institute of Technology
- (v) B.Tech./M.Tech.(Integrated) Chemical Technology to B.Tech./M.Tech.(Integrated) Chemical Engineering programme

The Council approved the changed nomenclature in respect of the following programmes in conformity with the approved list of degree in terms of section 22 of UGC Act:

- (i) Master of Environment Management to M.Sc. (Environment Management) programme:
- (ii) Master of Software Engineering to MCA (Software Engineering) programme:
- (iii) BCAM to BBA (CAM) programme
- (iv) Council also approved the changed nomenclature of degrees such as B.Tech. (Computer & Communication Engg.) to B.Tech. (Computer Science & Engg.) and B.Tech. (Electronics & Electrical Engg.) to B.Tech. (Electronics & Communication Engg.) in respect of programmes being conducted in Mahila Institute of Technology. This is with a view to rationalize the nomenclature of B.Tech. degrees offered by this University.
- (v) B.Tech./M.Tech.(Integrated) Chemical Technology to B.Tech./M.Tech. (Integrated) Chemical Engineering programme

## Agenda Item 9.8. To approve the Institute of Pathology by this University for its Ph.D. Programme.

The Council approved the institute of Pathology as a centre for conduct of Ph.D. programme of the University. It was also decided that possible recognition of teachers of this institute to act as Supervisor/Co-Supervisor may also be considered if they fulfill the



minimum qualifications prescribed for various teaching posts for the affiliated institutions in the university as per the University ordinance.

The Vice-Chancellor was authorised to take a decision in this regard.

# Agenda Item 9.9. To approve the minimum qualification and experience for teaching posts for Bachelor of Journalism (Mass Communication) programme

Council approved the minimum qualifications and experience for recruitment of teaching posts for Bachelor of Journalism (Mass Communication) programme as proposed in the agenda note.

Agenda Item No.9.10. To approve the introduction of part time Bachelor of Architecture course during the academic session 2002-2003 along with creation of posts.

The Council approved the introduction of part time B.Arch. course in the University School of Studies from the academic session 2002-2003 as approved by the AICTE and Council of Architecture and also approved the creation of following posts required during the first year and subsequent years as stipulated by AICTE:-

In addition to this, the Council also approved the engagement of visiting faculty for subjects like Architecture Design and Building Construction etc. as per requirement. The Vice-Chancellor also desired that the model curriculum be designed for this programme which was in need for so many years in Delhi for upgradation of skill and knowledge to the available qualified manpower. He further desired to work out details for conduct of this programme by the University in collaboration with three affiliated colleges with available qualified manpower.



# Agenda Item No. 9.11. Creation of additional posts for LLB programme introduced in the University School of Studies

The Council deliberated and approved the creation of posts for teaching faculty to meet the requirement of curriculum of LLB programme of 5 years duration with an intake of 60 students as under:-

Agenda Item No. 9.12. To approve the revised minimum qualifications and experience for teaching posts for Bachelor of Architecture and B.Ed. programme.

The Council approved the revised minimum qualifications and experience required for recruitment of teaching posts for B.Arch. and B.Ed. programms. However, Prof. A.G.K. Menon, Director, TVB School of Habitat Studies has mentioned that candidates having Ph.D. qualification are not available in the Architecture field. As such, he suggested that Ph.D. should not be made as an compulsory requirement for recruitment of Readers and Professors for B.Arch. programme. Vice-Chancellor desired that the committee of experts shall be constituted to examine this aspect & submit its recommendations alongwith full justification on the subject so that the matter may be placed before Board of Management for consideration.

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Agenda Item No. 9.13. To approve the ordinance relating to conduct and evaluation of University Examination for MBBS programme.

The Council approved the ordinance relating to conduct and evaluation of University examination for MBBS programme and Ordinance relating to conduct and evaluation of examinations for the Post Graduate Diplomas & Post Graduate Degrees.

The Council also authorized Vice-Chancellor to adopt any changes if required.

Agenda Item No. 9.14. To consider the proposal for designation of Head of the Department for the University School of Studies.

The matter was deliberated in detail and Council approved that in addition to the Dean of the School of Studies which may continue to be appointed as per Statute, the University may wherever required appoint Head of the Department in its own teaching departments and in such cases the Head of the Department may exercise all academic and administrative functions in respect of students, staff and purchases etc. for the campus programmes while the Dean has the academic privileges. It was further approved that normally HOD shall be appointed only if Professor of an affiliated college is appointed as Dean of the School or when there is no Professor appointed in the Department of the University meaning thereby that there shall not be both Dean and Head of Department in the same school of study within the University. The Vice-Chancellor was authorized to appoint Head of the Department from amongst the Professors/Readers of the University Teaching Departments, wherever required.

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# Agenda Item No. 9.15. Administrative control of the Teacher sharing the teaching load in two or more school of studies.

The Council appreciated the proposal, which will encourage indisciplinary teaching and research in various schools of the University. The Academic Council authorized the Vice Chancellor to identify such teachers who would be academically relevant to more than one school of the University. However, it would be necessary to identify one school to have the administrative control for such a teacher to avoid any ambiguity. In the other school, such a teacher will have all the academic privileges and will fully participate in the academic and research activities of the school practically as adjunct faculty.

Agenda Item No. 9.16 To approve the changed Syllabus of following programmes:

- (i) M.Tech. (Integrated) Information Technology programme being run in the University School of Studies (for the 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> semesters) &
- (ii) BBA (CAM) programme

The Council approved the syllabus and examination scheme of following programmes:-

- (i) The syllabus and examination scheme in respect of M.Tech. (Integrated)

  Information Technology programme for the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> semester and
- (ii) BBA (CAM) programme to be implemented from the academic session 2002-2003

Agenda Item No. 9.17. To approve the proposal for introduction of M.Tech. (Information Technology) – week end programme in the University School of Studies

Members appreciated the efforts made by the University to fill-up the vacuum of faculty in the specialized area of Information Technology. It was informed to the

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members that there are about 70 engineering/MCA colleges in the radius of 50 kilometers. But no M. Tech. (Information Technology) programme was offered in any of these colleges and there is a great shortage of IT faculty in the colleges and the minimum prescribed qualification for recruitment of senior faculty is M.Tech. In view of this, the scheme for introduction of M.Tech. (Information Technology) during the week ends has been prepared by the University. It was also informed to the members that there is a flexibility under the scheme regarding the admission criteria of this programme and bridge courses are being proposed to be designed for the candidates who are not B.Tech./M.Tech. (IT/CSE/ECE). The Council approved the proposal for introduction of this course from the academic session 2002-2003 and authorized the Vice Chancellor to approve the detailed curriculum alongwith scheme of examinations etc.

#### Agenda Item No. 9.18. To apprise the Academic Council regarding the details of Ph.D. scholars enrolled in the University Schools of Studies

The details of the students enrolled so far to pursue Ph.D. programme in various Schools of Studies was noted for information by the members.

#### Agenda Item No. 9.19. Any other items with the permission of the chair Evaluation Scheme of B.Arch. programme

It was pointed out by Prof. A.G.K. Menon, Director, TVB School of Habitat Studies that for B.Arch. programme which is of 5 years duration, there are 10 University examinations and in some cases the study scheme provides only 15 to 20 hours study per semester. Prof. Menon mentioned that some universities conduct examinations only during 4th and 5th year and during the first three years the colleges have been authorized to evaluate the students.

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Vice-Chancellor desired that there can be many models on the subject and after deliberations, it was decided that a committee may be constituted to examine the evaluation scheme for B.Arch programme and if necessary the university will conduct national workshop on the subject alongwith Council of Architecture to finalize the model for implementation. It was decided that Prof. A.G.K. Menon may initiate the action in this regard.

# Agenda Item 9.20 To consider the revision of ordinance relating to migration of students

The Council considered the proposed revised ordinance relating to migration of students. After deliberations the Council recommended the minor modifications in the proposed ordinance and after incorporating the changes suggested by the Council, the same is annexed at *Annexure-I*.

# Agenda Item 9.21 Revised scheme of examination and syllabi of Bachelor of Journalism (Mass Communication) for the academic session 2002-2003

The Council approved the revised scheme of examination and syllabi of Bachelor of Journalism (Mass Communication) for implementation from the academic session 2002-2003.

# Agenda Item 9.22 To approve the scheme of examination and syllabus including the elective papers for 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> semesters for B.Tech. programme

The Council approved the scheme of examination and syllabus including the elective papers for the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> semesters in respect of the following B.Tech. programmes:-

- (i) B. Tech. (Information Technology)
- (ii) B. Tech. (Computer Science & Engineering)
- (iii) B. Tech. (Electronics & Communication Engineering)
- (iv) B.Tech. (Mechanical & Automation Engineering)

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The Council also approved the syllabus and examination scheme of 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> semesters for B.Tech./M.Tech. (Integrated) (Chemical Technology) programme in the University School of Studies

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Council also approved the Syllabus and Examination Scheme of BSS (2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> year), B.E.-Commerce (2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> year) and BCA (1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup>) programme being conducted in collaboration with Zee Interaction Learning Systems Ltd.

### Agenda Item 9.23 Model Curriculum developed by University Grants Commission

The Council noted the list of model curriculums developed by the University Grants Commission in respect of various programmes and it was informed to the members that the same have been considered by the University for revision of syllabus.
